#### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO VACCINATIONS.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. Section 461-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended by amending the definition of "practice of pharmacy" to read as follows:

4 ""Practice of pharmacy" means:

5 The interpretation and evaluation of prescription (1)6 orders; the compounding, dispensing, and labeling of 7 drugs and devices (except labeling by a manufacturer, 8 packer, or distributor of nonprescription drugs and 9 commercially legend drugs and devices); the 10 participation in drug selection and drug utilization 11 reviews; the proper and safe storage of drugs and 12 devices and the maintenance of proper records 13 therefor; the responsibility for advising when 14 necessary or where regulated, of therapeutic values, 15 content, hazards, and use of drugs and devices; and 16 the interpretation and evaluation of prescription 17 orders to adjust the supply dispensed for purposes of



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medication synchronization pursuant to section 1 431:10A-606, 432:1-621, or 432D-30; 2 Performing the following procedures or functions as 3 (2) part of the care provided by and in concurrence with a 4 "health care facility" and "health care service" as 5 defined in section 323D-2, or a "pharmacy" or a 6 licensed physician or a licensed advanced practice 7 8 registered nurse with prescriptive authority, or a 9 "managed care plan" as defined in section 432E-1, in accordance with policies, procedures, or protocols 10 11 developed collaboratively by health professionals, 12 including physicians and surgeons, pharmacists, and 13 registered nurses, and for which a pharmacist has received appropriate training required by these 14 15 policies, procedures, or protocols: 16 (A) Ordering or performing routine drug therapy 17 related patient assessment procedures; 18 (B) Ordering drug therapy related laboratory tests; 19 Initiating emergency contraception oral drug (C) 20 therapy in accordance with a written 21 collaborative agreement approved by the board,

Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed 13 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored. 14 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect upon its approval. 15
