A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CONSERVATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that human activities 2 have contributed to the fragility of local habitats, leading to 3 a current crisis in the survival of Hawaiian plants and animals 4 and impacting public and private land use. Chapter 195D, Hawaii 5 Revised Statutes, provides that the intended purpose of all 6 habitat conservation plans, safe harbor agreements, incidental 7 take licenses, and subsequent actions is to promote recovery of 8 Hawaii's threatened and endangered species.

9 The purpose of this Act is to:

10 (1) Establish a habitat conservation program manager
11 position within the department of land and natural
12 resources and appropriate funds for the initial
13 establishment of the position; and
14 (2) Charge habitat conservation plan applicants an hourly
15 fee for all assistance provided by the habitat

16 conservation program manager, which shall be used to



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maintain the habitat conservation program manager position.

3 The legislature further finds that effective implementation 4 of Hawaii's endangered species law, section 195D-4, Hawaii 5 Revised Statutes, requires resources for adequate staffing. 6 Currently, the department of land and natural resources division 7 of forestry and wildlife has three administrative positions to 8 manage statewide projects, plus additional staff supported by 9 grants to produce standalone habitat conservation plans. The 10 incidental take licenses currently issued or approved by the 11 board of land and natural resources for these plans and agreements cover at least forty-five threatened or endangered 12 13 species on five islands, and the department of land and natural 14 resources is currently processing additional draft habitat 15 conservation plans and consulting on other potential projects 16 that will add at least fifteen more species. The State's 17 initiative to reach one hundred per cent renewable energy by 18 2045 is another factor that will likely result in more requests for incidental take licenses. The legislature finds that 19 20 funding a state civil service position to draft rules that 21 implement and clarify the intent of chapter 195D, Hawaii Revised



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1 Statutes, work with applicants for incidental take licenses to develop their projects to minimize and mitigate incidental take 2 3 of threatened and endangered species to the maximum extent 4 practicable, and track and monitor funds and expenditures 5 related to each habitat conservation plan project would further 6 improve the implementation of chapter 195D, Hawaii Revised 7 Statutes. This would provide greater consistency in issuing incidental take licenses, conducting follow-up monitoring for 8 9 development projects, and implementing and managing mitigation 10 and other projects that are extremely beneficial for the 11 recovery of Hawaii's threatened and endangered species. 12 SECTION 2. Chapter 195D, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 13 amended by adding a new section to part II to be appropriately 14 designated and to read as follows: 15 "§195D- Habitat conservation program manager; fees. 16 There is established within the department a habitat (a) 17 conservation program manager position. The habitat conservation 18 program manager shall draft rules that implement and clarify the 19 intent of this chapter, work with applicants for incidental take 20 licenses, as part of a habitat conservation plan, to develop 21 their projects to minimize and mitigate incidental take of



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1	threatened and endangered species to the maximum extent		
2	practicable, effectively track and monitor funds and		
3	expenditures related to habitat conservation plans, conduct		
4	follow-up monitoring for development projects, and implement and		
5	manage mitigation and other projects that benefit the recovery		
6	of threatened and endangered species.		
7	(b) The department shall charge all habitat conservation		
8	plan applicants an hourly rate of \$50 for all assistance		
9	provided to applicants by the habitat conservation program		
10	manager relating to their habitat conservation plan, including		
11	incidental take licenses. The fees collected pursuant to this		
12	subsection shall be deposited into the endangered species trust		
13	fund established under section 195D-31. The fee established by		
14	this subsection shall be in addition to any other applicable		
15	fee."		
16	SECTION 3. Section 195D-23, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
17	amended by amending subsection (d) to read as follows:		
18	(d) The department [may] <u>shall</u> establish a habitat		
19	conservation technical assistance program to assist landowners		
20	in developing, reviewing, or monitoring habitat conservation		
21	plans by providing technical assistance. The department may		



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1 collect fees and payment for costs incurred for use of the 2 technical assistance program in the development, review, or 3 monitoring of a specific habitat conservation plan. Fees shall 4 be charged at an hourly rate of \$50. The fees and payment for 5 costs collected pursuant to this subsection shall be deposited 6 into the endangered species trust fund established under section 7 195D-31."

8 SECTION 4. Section 195D-31, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
9 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:

10 "(a) There is established within the state treasury a 11 trust fund to be known as the endangered species trust fund to 12 be administered by the department to implement the purposes of 13 this chapter.

14 The fund shall consist of moneys from the following 15 sources:

16 (1) Moneys accrued from the sale of retail items
17 officially sponsored by the department for the fund;
18 (2) Private contributions for the management and recovery
19 of Hawaii's unique plants and animals;
20 (3) Fees and assessments charged for the use of public
21 land and waters and designated for the fund;



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1	(4)	Penalties, fines, or auctions resulting from
2		enforcement violations;
3	(5)	Legislative appropriations; [and]
4	(6)	Moneys deposited to implement the obligations of a
5		habitat conservation plan, as security for habitat
6		conservation plan funding, or technical assistance
7		program fees and payment for costs incurred for use of
8		the technical assistance program as set forth in
9		section 195D-23(d)[-]; and
10	(7)	Fees collected for assistance provided by the habitat
11		conservation program manager as set forth in section
12		195D- ; provided that the fees shall be used to
13		maintain the habitat conservation manager position
14		established pursuant to section 195D"
15	SECT	ION 5. There is appropriated out of the general
16	revenues	of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
17	much there	eof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2020-2021 for
18	start-up	costs for one full-time equivalent (1.0 FTE) state
19	civil ser	vice position established pursuant to section 2 of this
20	Act.	



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The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
 land and natural resources for the purposes of this Act.

3 SECTION 6. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed4 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

5 SECTION 7. This Act shall take effect upon its approval;
6 provided that section 5 shall take effect on July 1, 2020.

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Report Title:

Department of Land and Natural Resources; Habitat Conservation Plans; Incidental Take Licenses; Staff Position; Appropriation

Description:

Establishes a habitat conservation program manager position to be funded from fees charged to applicants for assistance provided to habitat conservation plan (HCP) applicants. Requires the habitat conservation program manager to draft rules that implement and clarify the intent of chapter 195D, Hawaii Revised Statutes, work with applicants for incidental take licenses, as part of a HCP, to develop their projects to minimize and mitigate incidental take of threatened and endangered species to the maximum extent practicable, effectively track and monitor funds and expenditures related to habitat conservation plans, conduct follow-up monitoring for development projects, and implement and manage mitigation and other projects that benefit the recovery of threatened and endangered species. Appropriates funds.
