A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that Hawaii is vulnerable
- 2 to catastrophic natural disasters such as earthquakes, tsunami,
- 3 floods, volcanic eruptions, and high winds that can devastate
- 4 communities.
- 5 The purpose of this Act is to improve the State's
- 6 preparedness for and response to communities affected by
- 7 disasters.
- 8 SECTION 2. Section 127A-3, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 9 amended to read as follows:
- 10 "§127A-3 Hawaii emergency management agency. (a) There
- 11 is established within the department of defense the Hawaii
- 12 emergency management agency. The adjutant general shall serve
- 13 as the director of Hawaii emergency management and, subject to
- 14 the direction and control of the governor, shall oversee the
- 15 agency.
- 16 (b) There shall be an administrator of emergency
- 17 management who shall be appointed, and may be removed, by the



- 1 director, and who shall have at least three years of experience
- 2 leading emergency management efforts at the local, state, or
- 3 federal level. The administrator of emergency management shall
- 4 be the civilian head of and responsible for the day-to-day
- 5 operations of the agency. The administrator of emergency
- 6 management shall report to the director. The administrator of
- 7 emergency management shall, in the absence of the director, have
- 8 all the duties and responsibilities of the director, and shall
- 9 report directly to the governor. The administrator of emergency
- 10 management shall not be subject to chapter 76.
- 11 (c) The administrator may, from funds allotted therefor,
- 12 employ technical, clerical, administrative, and other personnel
- 13 and make such expenditures as may be necessary.
- 14 (d) The administrator shall coordinate the activities of
- 15 the agency with all county emergency management agencies, other
- 16 state agencies, other states, or federal agencies involved in
- 17 emergency management activities, and all organizations for
- 18 emergency management within the State, whether public or
- 19 private, and shall maintain liaison and cooperate with all
- 20 county emergency management agencies, other state agencies,

- 1 other states, or federal agencies involved in emergency
- 2 management activities as provided in this chapter.
- 3 (e) The agency shall perform emergency management
- 4 functions within the territorial limits of the State. In
- 5 performing its duties, the agency shall:
- 6 (1) Prepare a state comprehensive emergency management
- 7 plan, which shall be integrated into and coordinated
- 8 with the emergency management plans of the federal
- 9 government. The plan shall be integrated by a
- 10 continuous, integrated comprehensive emergency
- 11 management program. The plan shall contain provisions
- 12 to ensure that the State is prepared for emergencies
- and minor, major, and catastrophic disasters. In
- 14 preparing and maintaining the plan, the agency shall
- work closely with agencies and organizations with
- 17 (2) Assign lead and support responsibilities to state
- agencies and personnel for emergency functions and
- other support activities;

1	(3)	Adopt standards and requirements for county emergency
2		management plans. The standards and requirements
3		shall ensure that county plans are coordinated and
4		consistent with the state comprehensive emergency
5		management plan;

1		including the partial or full mobilization of
2		emergency management forces and organizations in
3		advance of an actual emergency, to ensure the
4		availability of adequately trained and equipped forces
5		of emergency management personnel before, during, and
6		after emergencies and disasters;
7	(8)	Implement training programs to improve the ability of
8		state and local emergency management personnel to
9		prepare and implement emergency management plans and
10		programs. This shall include a continuous training
11		program for agencies and individuals that will be
12		called on to perform key roles in state and local
13		post-disaster response and recovery efforts and for
14		local government personnel on federal and state post-
15		disaster response and recovery strategies and
16		procedures;
17	(9)	Adopt standards and requirements for state agency

Requires the Hawaii emergency management agency to inventory all designated emergency shelters and their ability to withstand a category one hurricane or higher. Requires Hawaii emergency management agency to provide a list of shelters and their respective hurricane ratings to the legislature. Effective 7/1/2050. (HD1)
