A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO LEGAL SERVICES FOR LOW-INCOME IMMIGRANTS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that many immigrants seek 2 to continue or obtain legal status and citizenship in the 3 country. However, the immigration court process is highly 4 complex, which may be intimidating or overwhelming for 5 immigrants who may struggle with navigating a different culture 6 and language. Many immigrants face barriers to obtaining legal 7 status and citizenship. Low-income immigrants often lack the 8 resources to obtain legal representation, which may have a profound impact on the immigrants' ability to receive a fair 9 10 hearing.

11 The legislature further finds that Hawaii has always 12 welcomed people of all backgrounds, nationalities, and 13 ethnicities. According to the 2017 American Immigration Council 14 Fact Sheet, nearly eighteen per cent of Hawaii residents are 15 immigrants, while more than one in seven residents is a native-16 born United States citizen with at least one immigrant parent. 17 Immigrants are an integral part of Hawaii's diverse,

multicultural community and make extensive contributions to the
State.

Given the current political climate, a significant number of low-income immigrants are at risk of being detained or deported. Therefore, there are vital public policy reasons behind providing legal counsel to immigrants in immigration proceedings.

8 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to appropriate 9 funds to the department of labor and industrial relations, 10 office of community services to contract with non-profit 11 providers to provide low-income immigrants with legal counsel to 12 assist and represent them in immigration proceedings and provide 13 assistance on immigrant status issues.

14 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general 15 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$150,000 or so much 16 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2020-2021 for the 17 department of labor and industrial relations, office of 18 community services to contract with non-profit providers to 19 provide low-income immigrants with legal counsel to assist and 20 represent them in immigration proceedings and provide assistance 21 on immigrant status issues.
