A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HEALTH.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that there is a shortage 2 of primary care providers in the State, which will be 3 exacerbated by the projected retirements of current physicians, 4 advanced practice registered nurses, and pharmacists. Further, 5 although students are interested in pursuing careers in the 6 healthcare service industry in Hawaii, in-state educational 7 institutions are constrained by the lack of clinical education 8 sites in Hawaii and the limited supply of qualified primary care 9 preceptors. One way to encourage participation of preceptors is 10 to offer a tax credit for professionals who serve as preceptors.

11 The purpose of the existing preceptor tax credit is to
12 incentivize volunteer preceptors to offer professional
13 instruction, training, and supervision to students and residents
14 seeking careers as healthcare providers by providing a tax
15 credit to volunteer preceptors. The first-year implementation
16 of the preceptor tax credit found that though a large number of
17 providers trained eligible students in 2019, only a small subset

met the eligibility requirements due to the primary care
 qualifying criteria.

3 The legislature further finds that training physicians, 4 advanced practice registered nurses, and pharmacists in primary care requires training from specialties that support primary 5 6 care, in addition to training from primary care providers, and 7 that the definition of volunteer-based supervised clinical 8 training rotation may be improved for clarity to facilitate the 9 preceptor tax credit assurance committee's implementation of the 10 credit.

11 Therefore, the purpose of this Act is to:

12 (1) Amend the definition of "primary care providers" and
13 "volunteer based supervised clinical training

14 rotation" to improve accessibility for providers to

15 receive income tax credits for acting as preceptors; 16 and

17 (2) Revise the membership of the preceptor credit

18 assurance committee to include the director of health19 and director of taxation.

20 SECTION 2. Section 235-110.25, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
21 amended by amending subsection (g) to read as follows:

14	means a degree or certificate that fulfills a requirement to be

17	or a pharmacist, pursuant to chapter 461.		
18	"Eligible student" means an advanced practice registered

1 "Medical student" means an individual participating in a 2 nationally accredited academic program leading to the medical 3 doctor or doctor of osteopathy degree. "Medical student" 4 includes graduates from nationally accredited academic programs 5 who have continued their training, in the role of resident or 6 fellow, to obtain the additional qualifications needed for 7 medical licensure, pursuant to chapter 453, or specialty 8 certification.

9 "Nationally accredited" means holding an institutional 10 accreditation by name to offer post-secondary medical primary 11 care education. Accreditation for medical students shall be 12 offered by the Liaison Committee on Medical Education or 13 American Osteopathic Association Commission on Osteopathic College Accreditation. Accreditation for advanced practice 14 15 registered nurse students shall be offered by the Commission on 16 Collegiate Nursing Education.

17 "Pharmacy student" means an individual participating in an
18 academic program that is nationally accredited for the training
19 of individuals to become registered pharmacists pursuant to
20 chapter 461.

"Preceptor" means a physician or osteopathic physician, 1 licensed pursuant to chapter 453, an advanced practice 2 registered nurse, licensed pursuant to chapter 457, or a 3 4 pharmacist, licensed pursuant to chapter 461, who is a resident 5 of Hawaii and who maintains a professional [primary care] 6 practice in this State [-] and whose specialty supports the 7 development and training of an eligible student in primary care. "Primary care" means the principal point of continuing care 8 9 for patients provided by a healthcare provider, including health promotion, disease prevention, health maintenance, counseling, 10 patient education, diagnosis and treatment of acute and chronic 11 illnesses, and coordination of other specialist care that the 12 13 patient may need. "Volunteer-based supervised clinical training rotation" 14 means an uncompensated, by monetary reimbursement or fiscal 15 award, period of supervised clinical training of [an] eligible 16 17 student or students that totals at least eighty hours of supervisory time annually, in which a preceptor provides 18 personalized instruction, training, and supervision to an 19

3 SECTION 3. Section 321-2.7, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
4 amended by amending subsections (a) and (b) to read as follows:
5 "(a) There is established the preceptor credit assurance
6 committee within the department of health. The committee shall
7 develop and implement a plan for certifying healthcare preceptor
8 tax credits under section 235-110.25, including:

9 (1) Developing a process ensuring that requests for credit
10 certification are reviewed and verifications are
11 processed no later than thirty days following the
12 close of each calendar year;

13 (2) Developing the documentation process for the committee
14 to certify a preceptor for the tax credit; provided
15 that the documentation to be collected shall include:
16 (A) The preceptor's name, address, place of practice,
17 and Hawaii provider license number;
