A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO WILDLIFE RESOURCES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that for several decades 2 and especially since 1979, the department of land and natural 3 resources and its partners, including the United States Fish and Wildlife Service, United States Department of Agriculture, and 4 5 other agencies, have ignored traditional, recreational, and 6 culturally dependent resources users and have enacted wildlife 7 resource management policies and practices without ever 8 adequately engaging with the typical users of the resources. 9 The legislature further finds that the stakeholders who are

10 most affected by decisions made by the department of land and 11 natural resources and its partners regarding wildlife and 12 wildlife resources should have opportunities to express their 13 concerns over practices that modify access, utilization, or 14 management of these resources.

15 The purpose of this Act is to require the department of 16 land and natural resources to manage and administer the wildlife 17 and wildlife resources of the State through cooperative resource

3	SECTION 2. Section 183D-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
4	amended by adding a new definition to be appropriately inserted		
5	and to read as follows:		
6	""Cooperative resource management" means a process for the		
7	management of public resources that identifies and actively		
8	involves stakeholders with a compelling interest, such as		
9	recreation, hunting, or gathering."		
10	SECTION 3. Section 183D-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
11	amended to read as follows:		
12	"§183D-2 Powers and duties of department. The department		
13	shall:		
14	(1) Manage and administer the wildlife and wildlife		
15	resources of the State[+] through cooperative resource

3	(3)	Establish and maintain wildlife propagating facility
4		or facilities;
5	(4)	Subject to the provisions of title 12, import wildlife
6		for the purpose of propagating and disseminating the
7		same in the State and the waters subject to its
8		jurisdiction;
9	(5)	Distribute, free of charge, as the department deems to
10		be in the public interest, game for the purpose of
11		increasing the food supply of the State; provided that
12		when in the discretion of the department the public
13		interest will not be materially interfered with by so
14		doing, the department may propagate and furnish
15		wildlife to private parties, upon such reasonable
16		terms, conditions, and prices as the department may
17		determine;
18	(6)	Ascertain, compile, and disseminate, free of charge,
19		information and advice as to the best methods of
20		protecting, propagating, and distributing wildlife in
21		the State and the waters subject to its jurisdiction;



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1	(7)	Gather and compile information and statistics
2		concerning the area, location, character, and increase
3		and decrease of wildlife in the State;
4	(8)	Gather and compile information concerning wildlife
5		recommended for release in different localities,
6		including the care and propagation of wildlife for
7		protective, productive, and aesthetic purposes and
8		other useful information, which the department deems
9		proper;
10	(9)	Have the power to manage and regulate all lands which
11		may be set apart as game management areas, public
12		hunting areas, and wildlife sanctuaries;
13	(10)	Pursuant to section 183D-65 of this chapter, destroy
14		predators deemed harmful to wildlife;
15	(11)	Formulate, and from time to time recommend to the
16		governor and legislature, such additional legislation
17		necessary or desirable to implement the objectives of
18		title 12; and
19	(12)	Preserve, protect, and promote public hunting."

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SECTION 4. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
begun before its effective date.
SECTION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on December 31,
