A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO TOURISM.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature finds that tourism is the
largest private sector industry in the State and that Hawaii is
known globally for stunning natural beauty, unique culture, and
the spirit of aloha. A successful tourism industry in Hawaii
depends on the health of natural and cultural resources,
communities, economy, and relationships with visitors.

7 The legislature further finds that the tourism industry has a prominent role to play in protecting the State's natural 8 9 resources, perpetuating Hawaii's history, and preserving a high 10 quality of life for Hawaii's residents, by switching the focus 11 of the State's tourism industry from marketing Hawaii to helping 12 to manage Hawaii's resources. The legislature additionally 13 finds that requiring sustainable practices and professional tour 14 guide certification from persons in the tourism industry may 15 advance this goal, in addition to enhancing visitor experiences 16 and protecting Hawaii's brand.



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1	The purpose of this Act is to convene a professional tour		
2	guide certification task force to develop plans and a schedule		
3	to implement professional tour guide certification programs.		
4	SECTION 2. (a) The professional tour guide certification		
5	task force is established within the office of the lieutenant		
6	governor for administrative purposes.		
7	(b) The task force shall:		
8	(1) Examine whether it is appropriate to require persons		
9	who use various state resources for commercial		
10	purposes or apply for various commercial use permits		
11	to hold and maintain certification or meet minimum		
12	requirements to ensure that these persons understand		
13	principles of sustainable tourism and implement those		
14	principles into their commercial endeavors. The types		
15	of state resources and commercial use permits that may		
16	be considered include but are not limited to the Na		
17	Ala Hele trail system, state parks, small boat		
18	harbors, ocean recreation management areas,		
19	instructor/operator permits, and common carrier		
20	certificates and contract carrier permits covering the		
21	transportation of passengers;		

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1	(2)	If the task force determines that it is appropriate to
2		require persons who use various state resources for
3		commercial purposes or apply for various commercial
4		use permits, recommend existing certificates or
5		certification programs that may be appropriate for
6		this purpose; and
7	(3)	Make recommendations and plans regarding any necessary
8		certification and renewal.
9	(C)	The task force shall consist of the following members,
10	or their	designated representatives:
11	(1)	The lieutenant governor's chief of staff, who shall
12		serve as chairperson;
13	(2)	The comptroller;
14	(3)	The director of finance;
15	(4)	The president of the University of Hawaii system;
16	(5)	The chief executive officer of the Hawaii health
17		systems corporation;
18	(6)	The superintendent of education;
19	(7)	The chairperson of the board of land and natural
20		resources;
21	(8)	The director of transportation;



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1	(9)	A member of the house of representatives, appointed by		
2		the speaker of the house of representatives;		
3	(10)	A member of the senate, appointed by the president of		
4		the senate;		
5	(11)	A private sector representative, appointed by the		
6		speaker of the house of representatives; and		
7	(12)	A private sector representative, appointed by the		
8		president of the senate.		
9	Task forc	e members may recommend additional members with		
10	appropriate specialized expertise to join the task force,			
11	subject to approval by the chairperson.			
12	(d)	The task force shall submit a preliminary report,		
13	including	an update on the task force's progress and any		
14	anticipated needs for completion, to the legislature no later			
15	than Octo	ber 31, 2020.		
16	(e)	The task force shall submit a final report of its		
17	findings	and recommendations, including any proposed		
18	legislati	on, to the legislature no later than twenty days prior		
19	to the co	nvening of the regular session of 2021.		
20	SECT	ION 3. There is appropriated out of the general		
21	revenues	of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so		



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1 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2019-2020 and 2 the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal 3 year 2020-2021 for the professional tour guide certification 4 task force to examine and plan, as necessary, professional tour 5 guide certification programs and the necessity of certification, 6 pursuant to section 2 of this Act.

7 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the office of8 the lieutenant governor for the purposes of this Act.

9 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2019.
