A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO TOURISM.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that tourism is the
- 2 largest private sector industry in the State and that Hawaii is
- 3 known globally for stunning natural beauty, unique culture, and
- 4 the spirit of aloha. A successful tourism industry in Hawaii
- 5 depends on the health of natural and cultural resources,
- 6 communities, economy, and relationships with visitors.
- 7 The legislature further finds that the tourism industry has
- 8 a prominent role to play in protecting the State's natural
- 9 resources, perpetuating Hawaii's history, and preserving a high
- 10 quality of life for Hawaii's residents, by switching the focus
- 11 of the State's tourism industry from marketing Hawaii to helping
- 12 to manage Hawaii's resources. The legislature additionally
- 13 finds that requiring sustainable practices and professional tour
- 14 guide certification from persons in the tourism industry may
- 15 advance this goal, in addition to enhancing visitor experiences
- 16 and protecting Hawaii's brand.

1	The purpose of this Act is to convene a professional tour
2	guide certification task force to develop plans and a schedule
3	to implement professional tour guide certification programs.
4	SECTION 2. (a) The professional tour guide certification
5	task force is established within the department of business,
6	economic development, and tourism for administrative purposes.
7	(b) The task force shall:
8	(1) Examine whether it is appropriate to require persons
9	who use various state resources for commercial
10	purposes or apply for various commercial use permits
11	to hold and maintain certification or meet certain
12	minimum requirements to ensure that these persons
13	understand the principles of sustainable tourism and
14	implement those principles into their commercial
15	endeavors; provided that the types of state resources
16	and commercial use permits that may be considered
17	include but are not limited to the Na Ala Hele trail
18	system, state parks, small boat harbors, ocean
19	recreation management areas, instructor/operator
20	permits, and common carrier certificates and contract

1		carrier permits covering the transportation of
2		passengers;
3	(2)	If the task force determines that it is appropriate to
4		require the persons described in paragraph (1) to hold
5		and maintain certification or meet certain minimum
6		requirements, recommend existing certificates or
7		certification programs that may be appropriate; and
8	(3)	Make recommendations and plans regarding any necessary
9		certifications and certification renewals.
10	(C)	The task force shall consist of the following members,
11	or their	designated representatives:
12	(1)	The chairperson of the board of directors of the
13		Hawaii tourism authority, who shall serve as co-chair;
14	(2)	The state sustainability coordinator, who shall serve
15		as co-chair;
16	(3)	The director of business, economic development and
17		tourism;
18	(4)	The chairperson of the public utilities commission;
19	(5)	The administrator of the division of state parks of
20	•	the department of land and natural resources;

- 1 Task force members may recommend additional members with
- 2 appropriate specialized expertise to join the task force,
- 3 subject to approval by the co-chairs.
- 4 (e) The task force shall submit a preliminary report,
- 5 including an update on the task force's progress and any
- 6 anticipated needs for completion, to the legislature no later
- 7 than November 30, 2019.
- **8** (f) The task force shall submit a final report of its
- 9 findings and recommendations, including any proposed
- 10 legislation, to the legislature no later than twenty days prior
- 11 to the convening of the regular session of 2020.
- 12 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
- 13 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
- 14 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2019-2020 for
- 15 the professional tour guide certification task force to examine
- 16 the necessity of professional tour guide certification and, if
- 17 applicable, make corresponding plans pursuant to section 2 of
- 18 this Act.
- 19 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 20 business, economic development, and tourism for the purposes of
- 21 this Act.

1 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2019.
