A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The Hawaii Revised Statutes is amended by
2	adding a new chapter to be appropriately designated and to read
3	as follows:
4	"CHAPTER
5	PLASTIC STRAWS, PLASTIC BAGS, POLYSTYRENE FOAM CONTAINERS, AND
6	EXPANDED POLYSTYRENE FOOD SERVICE PRODUCTS
7	§ -1 Definitions. As used in this chapter:
8	"Carryout bag" means a bag provided by a store or food
9	service business to a customer at the point of sale for the
10	purpose of transporting groceries or retail goods.
11	"Department" means the department of health.
12	"Expanded polystyrene" means blown polystyrene and expanded
13	and extruded foams that are thermoplastic petrochemical
14	materials utilizing a styrene monomer and processed by a number
15	of techniques, including, but not limited to, fusion of polymer
16	spheres (expandable bead polystyrene), injection molding, foam
17	molding, and extrusion-blow molding (extruded foam polystyrene).

1 "Expanded polystyrene food service product" means a product 2 made, in whole or in part, of expanded polystyrene that is used for selling or providing a food or beverage, and includes, but 3 is not limited to, a food container, plate, hot or cold beverage 4 5 cup, meat or vegetable tray, or egg carton. "Expanded 6 polystyrene food service product" does not include a product 7 used to package raw, uncooked, or butchered meat, fish, poultry, 8 or seafood for off-premises consumption.

9 "Food service business" means a business that sells or 10 provides prepared food for consumption on or off the premises, 11 and includes any restaurant, bar area that is part of a restaurant, café, delicatessen, coffee shop, catering facility, 12 13 supermarket or grocery store, vending truck or cart, food truck, 14 sandwich stand, movie theater, or business or institutional 15 cafeteria, including those operated by or on behalf of the 16 State.

17 "Plastic" means any material made of polymeric organic 18 compounds and additives that can be shaped by flow. 19 "Plastic bag" means a bag that is made from plastic. 20 "Plastic straw" means a straw that is made wholly or 21 partially from plastic.

"Polystyrene" means a thermoplastic petrochemical material 1 utilizing a styrene monomer, including all polystyrene, meaning 2 3 any styrene or vinyl chloride polymer that is blown into a foam-4 like material. Polystyrene includes materials created from techniques including the fusion of polymer spheres (expandable 5 bead polystyrene), injection molding, foam molding, and 6 7 extrusion-blow molding (extruded foam polystyrene). "Polystyrene foam container" means a container that is made 8 9 from polystyrene. "Prepared food" means food or beverages that are prepared 10 11 to be consumed on or off the premises of a food service 12 business. 13 "Store" means any grocery store, supermarket, convenience store, liquor store, pharmacy, drug store, or other retail 14 15 establishment that has over one thousand square feet of retail space and that provides carryout bags to its customers as a 16 17 result of the sale of a product. Prohibition on the sale, use, or distribution of 18 S -2 plastic straws, plastic bags, polystyrene foam containers, and 19

1 Distribute, sell, offer for sale, or otherwise provide (1)2 any plastic straws, plastic bags, or polystyrene foam 3 containers, or expanded polystyrene food service 4 products, to a customer; or 5 (2) Serve or package prepared food in plastic bags, 6 polystyrene foam containers, or expanded polystyrene 7 food service products, or accompanied by plastic 8 straws. 9 (b) No store operating in this State shall provide a 10 plastic carryout bag to a customer. 11 S Penalties. Any person who violates this chapter - 3 12 shall be subject to a penalty of up to \$5,000 for each offense. 13 Each day of each violation shall constitute a separate offense. 14 -4 Rules. The department of health shall adopt rules S 15 pursuant to chapter 91 necessary to implement this chapter, 16 including rules relating to enforcement and exemptions. The 17 rules may also include a requirement for stores and food service 18 businesses to educate their customers regarding proper disposal 19 of non-reusable food containers and litter reduction. 20 S -5 Relation to other laws. This chapter shall not 21 preempt the authority of a county to adopt and enforce

1 additional single-use take-out food packaging ordinances that
2 are more restrictive than the standards established under this
3 chapter."

4 SECTION 2. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
5 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
6 begun before its effective date.

7 SECTION 3. If any provision of this Act, or the 8 application thereof to any person or circumstance, is held 9 invalid, the invalidity does not affect other provisions or 10 applications of the Act that can be given effect without the 11 invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions 12 of this Act are severable.

13 SECTION 4. Nothing in this Act shall be interpreted or 14 applied so as to create any requirement, power, or duty in 15 conflict with any federal law.

16 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2021.17
