A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO BEHAVIOR ANALYSIS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that behavior analysis
- 2 means the design, implementation, and evaluation of
- 3 instructional and environmental modifications to produce
- 4 socially significant improvements in human behavior. The
- 5 practice of behavior analysis includes the empirical
- 6 identification of functional relations between behavior and
- 7 environmental factors, known as functional assessment and
- 8 analysis, as well as the use of contextual factors, motivating
- 9 operations, antecedent stimuli, positive reinforcement and other
- 10 consequences to help people develop new behaviors, increase or
- 11 decrease existing behaviors, and emit behaviors under specific
- 12 environmental conditions.
- 13 The legislature further finds that Act 199, Session Laws of
- 14 Hawaii 2015, established licensing requirements for behavior
- 15 analysts. Licensing of behavior analysis services was made
- 16 concurrent with mandated insurance coverage for the diagnosis
- 17 and treatment of autism spectrum disorders.

1 The legislature additionally finds that many students 2 enrolled in department of education schools would benefit from 3 the expansion of behavior analysis services throughout the 4 State's public school system, including students with autism 5 spectrum disorders. 6 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to fund behavior 7 analysis services for public school students. 8 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general 9 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much 10 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2019-2020 and the 11 same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 12 2020-2021 for the department of education to provide public 13 school students with behavior analysis services performed by the following individuals: 14 15 (1) Licensed behavior analysts; 16 (2) Board certified assistant behavior analysts under the supervision of one or more licensed behavior analysts; 17 18 (3) Students pursuing a graduate level certificate in 19 behavior analysis under the supervision of one or more 20 licensed behavior analysts;

- 1 SECTION 3. The department of education shall seek any
- 2 necessary approvals from the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid
- 3 Services to amend the state medicaid plan to provide
- 4 reimbursements for applied behavior analysis services to
- 5 medicaid-eligible students diagnosed with an autism spectrum
- 6 disorder.
- 7 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.
