A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO RECYCLING.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The legislature finds that S.C.R. No. 74,
2	S.D. 1, H.D. 1, regular session of 2014, requested the office of
3	the auditor to conduct an audit of the department of health's
4	advance disposal fee program. In response, the office of the
5	auditor released Report No. 14-17 in December 2014, which
6	recommended that the department of health:
7	(1) Consider combining the advance disposal fee and
8	deposit beverage container glass processing streams to
9	increase efficiency and decrease costs while
10	increasing the supply of glass available for down-
11	cycling;
12	(2) Update and finalize the 2008 department of health
13	policy glass recycling draft dated July 1, 2008, to:
14	(A) Equally allow recycling or down-cycling;
15	(B) Clearly allow stockpiling of glass for the
16	purposes of maintaining inventory;

1		(C) Include a complete list of approved down-cycling
2		options to allow recyclers more flexibility in
3		marketing their product; and
4		(D) Allow the use of glass as alternative daily cover
5		in the down-cycling options;
6	(3)	Work with stakeholders to make practical policies and
7		rules governing the stockpiling of processed glass;
8		and
9	(4)	Increase the recovery rate for advance disposal fee
10		glass containers to seventy-five per cent, which is
11		approximately the same redemption rate that the
12		deposit beverage container program has achieved,
13		through increased funding of the "buy back" program
14		and an increase in the advance disposal fee rate.
15	The p	ourpose of this Act is to mandate the department of
16	health to	adopt and implement the recommendations made by the
17	auditor.	
18	SECT	ON 2. The department of health shall:
19	(1)	Perform a cost-benefit analysis of and consider
20		combining the advance disposal fee glass containers,
21		under section 342G, part VII, Hawaii Revised Statutes,

1		and o	deposit beverage container glass, under section
2		342G	, part VIII, Hawaii Revised Statutes, processing
3		stre	ams;
4	(2)	Updat	te the 2008 department of health policy glass
5		recy	cling draft dated July 1, 2008. The updated
6		poli	cy shall:
7		(A)	Equally allow recycling or down-cycling;
8		(B)	Clearly allow stockpiling of glass for the
9			purposes of maintaining inventory;
10		(C)	Include a complete list of approved down-cycling
11			options; and
12		(D)	Allow the use of glass as an alternative daily
13			cover in the down-cycling options;
14	(3)	Work	with stakeholders to make practical policies and
15		rules	governing the stockpiling of processed glass;
16		and	
17	(4)	Incre	ease the recovery rate for advance disposal fee
18		glass	s containers to seventy-five per cent.
19	SECT	ION 3	. The department of health shall submit a report
20	to the le	gislat	ture no later than twenty days prior to the

1	convening	of the 2020 regular session. The report shall			
2	include:				
3	(1)	All findings and recommendations, including any			
4		proposed legislation, with regard to combining the			
5		advance disposal fee glass container and deposit			
6		beverage container glass processing streams;			
7	(2)	The updated policy of the 2008 department of health			
8		policy glass recycling draft dated July 1, 2008;			
9	(3)	All new policies and rules governing the stockpiling			
10		of processed glass; and			
11	(4)	Plans to increase the recovery rate for advance			
12		disposal fee glass containers to seventy-five per			
13		cent.			
14	SECT	ION 4. There is appropriated out of the general			
15	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$100,000 or so much				
16	thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2019-2020 to conduc				
17	a cost-benefit analysis of combining the advance disposal fee				
18	glass container and deposit beverage container glass processing				
19	streams.				
20	The s	sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of			
21	health for	r the purposes of this Act.			

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SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2019.

Report Title:

Department of Health; Advance Disposal Fee Glass Container; Deposit Beverage Container Glass; Recycling; Appropriation

Description:

Mandates implementation of recommendations made by the office of the auditor to the department of health regarding advance disposal fee glass containers and deposit beverage container glass. Requires the department of health to report on its implementation of the recommendations to the legislature. Appropriates funds to the department of health to conduct a cost-benefit analysis of combining the advance disposal fee glass container and deposit beverage container glass processing streams.

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
