## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO RANKED CHOICE VOTING.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. Chapter 11, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended
by adding a new section to be appropriately designated and to
read as follows:

"§11- Ranked choice voting; application; procedure. (a) 4 5 Any federal election not held on the date of a regularly scheduled primary or general election and any special election 6 7 for a vacant seat on a county council shall be conducted by 8 ranked choice voting. For any election conducted by ranked 9 choice voting, the election proclamation required pursuant to 10 section 11-91 shall state that votes shall be cast and tabulated 11 using ranked choice voting and provide an explanation of ranked 12 choice voting. 13 Except as provided in subsections (c) and (d), the (b) following procedures shall be used to determine the winner of an 14 15 election conducted by ranked choice voting:

16 (1) Tabulation of votes shall proceed in rounds;

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1	(2)	<u>In e</u>	ach round, the number of votes for each continuing
2		cand	idate shall be counted, with each continuing
3		ball	ot counting as one vote for its highest-ranked
4		<u>cont</u>	inuing candidate for that round;
5	(3)	Inac	tive ballots shall not be counted for any

7	(4)	The	round shall end with one of two potential
8		outc	omes:
9		(A)	If there are two or fewer continuing candidates,
10			the candidate with the most votes is declared the
11			winner of the election; or
12		<u>(B)</u>	If there are more than two continuing candidates,
13			the last-place candidate is defeated and a new
14			round begins.
15	(C)	A ti	e under this section between candidates for the
16	most vote	s in	the final round or a tie between last-place
17	candidate	s in	any round shall be decided by lot, and the
18	candidate	chos	en by lot shall be defeated.
19	(d)	The	office of elections may modify a ranked-choice
20	voting ba	llot	and tabulation; provided that:

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1	(1)	The number of allowable rankings may be limited to no				
2		fewer than six; and				
3	(2)	Two or more candidates may be defeated simultaneously				
4		by batch elimination in any round of tabulation.				
5	<u>(e)</u>	For the purposes of this section:				
6	"Bat	ch elimination" means the simultaneous defeat of				
7	multiple	candidates for whom it is mathematically impossible to				
8	be electe	<u>d.</u>				
9	"Con	tinuing ballot" means a ballot that is not an inactive				
10	ballot.					
11	"Hig	hest continuing ranking" means the highest ranking on a				
12	voter's b	allot for a continuing candidate.				
13	<u>"Ina</u>	ctive ballot" means a ballot that does not rank any				
14	<u>continuin</u>	g candidate, contains an overvote at the highest				
15	<u>continuin</u>	g ranking, or contains two or more sequential skipped				
16	rankings	rankings before its highest continuing ranking.				
17	"Las	t-place candidate" means the candidate with the fewest				
18	votes in	a round of ranked-choice voting tabulation.				
19	"Mat	hematically impossible to be elected", with respect to				
20	<u>a candida</u>	te, means that:				



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1	(1)	The candidate cannot be elected because the
2		candidate's vote total in a round of the ranked-choice
3		voting tabulation plus all votes that could possibly
4		be transferred to the candidate in future rounds from
5		candidates with fewer votes or an equal number of
6		votes would not be enough to surpass the candidate
7		with the next-higher vote total in the round; or
8	(2)	The candidate has a lower vote total than a candidate
9		described in paragraph (1).
10	"Ove	rvote" means a circumstance in which a voter has ranked
11	more than	one candidate at the same ranking.
12	<u>"Ran</u>	ked choice voting" means the method of casting and
13	tabulatin	g votes in which voters rank candidates in order of
14	preferenc	e, tabulation proceeds in sequential rounds in which
15	last-plac	e candidates are defeated, and the candidate with the
16	most vote	s in the final round is elected.
17	<u>"Ran</u>	king" means the number assigned on a ballot by a voter
18	to a cand	idate to express the voter's preference for that
19	candidate	, in which number one is the highest ranking, number
20	two is th	e next-highest ranking, and so on.

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1 "Round" means an instance of the sequence of voting 2 tabulation steps established in subsection (b). 3 "Skipped ranking" means a circumstance in which a voter has 4 left a ranking blank and ranks a candidate at a subsequent 5 ranking." 6 SECTION 2. Section 11-112, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 7 amended to read as follows: "§11-112 Contents of ballot. (a) The ballot shall 8 contain the names of the candidates, their party affiliation or 9 10 nonpartisanship in partisan election contests, the offices for which they are running, and the district in which the election 11 12 is being held. In multimember races the ballot shall state that the voter shall not vote for more than the number of seats 13 available or the number of candidates listed where [such] the 14 15 number of candidates is [less] fewer than the number of seats 16 available. The ballot may include questions concerning proposed 17 (b) 18 state constitutional amendments, proposed county charter 19 amendments, or proposed initiative or referendum issues. (c) At the chief election officer's discretion, the ballot 20 may have a background design imprinted onto it. 21

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1	(d) When the electronic voting system is used, the ballot			
2	may have pre-punched codes and printed information which			
3	identify the voting districts, precincts, and ballot sets to			
4	facilitate the electronic data processing of these ballots.			
5	(e) The name of the candidate may be printed with the			
6	Hawaiian or English equivalent or nickname, if the candidate so			
7	requests in writing at the time the candidate's nomination			
8	papers are filed. Candidates' names, including the Hawaiian or			
9	English equivalent or nickname, shall be set on one line.			
10	(f) The ballot shall bear no word, motto, device, sign, or			
11	symbol other than as allowed in this title.			
12	(g) The ballot may include information necessary to use			
13	ranked choice voting as described in section 11"			
14	SECTION 3. Section 11-151, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is			
15	amended to read as follows:			
16	"§11-151 Vote count. [Each] Except for contests conducted			
17	by ranked choice voting pursuant to section 11- , each contest			
18	or question on a ballot shall be counted independently as			
19	follows:			
20	(1) If the votes cast in a contest or <u>on a</u> question are			
21	equal to or less than the number to be elected or			



1		chosen for that contest or question, the votes for
2		that contest or question shall be counted;
3	(2)	If the votes cast in a contest or <u>on a</u> question exceed
4		the number to be elected or chosen for that contest or
5		question, the votes for that contest or question shall
6		not be counted; and
7	(3)	If a contest or question requires a majority of the
8		votes for passage, any blank, spoiled, or invalid
9		ballot shall not be tallied for passage or as votes
10		cast except that such ballots shall be counted as
11		votes cast in ratification of a constitutional
12		amendment or a question for a constitutional
13		convention."
14	SECT	ION 4. Section 11-152, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
15	amended t	o read as follows:
16	"§11	-152 Method of counting. (a) In an election using
17	the paper	ballot voting system, immediately after the close of
18	the polls	, the chairperson of the precinct officials shall open
19	the ballo	t box. The precinct officials at the precinct shall
20	proceed t	o count the votes as follows:

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1 (1)The whole number of ballots shall first be counted to 2 see if their number corresponds with the number of 3 ballots cast as recorded by the precinct officials; (2)If the number of ballots corresponds with the number 4 5 of persons recorded by the precinct officials as having voted, the precinct officials shall then 6 7 proceed to count the [vote] votes cast for each 8 candidate; and 9 If there are more ballots or less ballots than the (3) record calls for the precinct officials shall proceed 10 11 as directed in section 11-153. 12 In those precincts using the electronic voting system, (b) 13 the ballots shall be taken in the sealed ballot boxes to the 14 counting center according to the procedure and schedule 15 promulgated by the chief election officer to promote the 16 security of the ballots. In the presence of official observers, 17 counting center employees may start to count the ballots prior 18 to the closing of the polls provided there shall be no printout by the computer or other disclosure of the number of votes cast 19 20 for a candidate or on a question prior to the closing of the polls. For the purposes of this section, the closing of the 21

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1 polls is that time identified in section 11-131 as the closing 2 hour of voting. 3 (c) In an election conducted by ranked choice voting, 4 votes shall be counted as provided in section 11- ." 5 SECTION 5. Section 11-155, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 6 amended to read as follows: "§11-155 Certification of results of election. On receipt 7 8 of certified tabulations from the election officials concerned, 9 the chief election officer in state elections or county clerk in 10 county elections shall compile, certify, and release the election results after the expiration of the time for bringing 11 12 an election contest. The certification shall be based on a 13 comparison and reconciliation of the following: The results of the canvass of ballots conducted 14 (1)15 pursuant to chapter 16; 16 The audit of pollbooks (and related record books) and (2)17 resultant overage and underage report; 18 (3) The audit results of the manual audit team; 19 The results of the absentee ballot reconciliation (4)20 report compiled by the clerks; and

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1 All logs, tally sheets, and other documents generated (5) 2 during the election and in the canvass of the election 3 results. 4 A certificate of election or a certificate of results declaring 5 the results of the election as of election day shall be issued 6 pursuant to section 11-156; provided that in the event of an overage or underage, a list of all precincts in which an overage 7 8 or underage occurred shall be attached to the certificate. The 9 [number of] candidates to be elected [receiving-the-highest 10 number of] who receive the most votes in any election district 11 shall be declared to be elected [-]; provided that candidates for 12 offices elected by ranked choice voting shall be declared to be 13 elected pursuant to section 11- . Unless otherwise provided, 14 the term of office shall begin or end as of the close of polls 15 on election day. The position on the question receiving the 16 appropriate majority of the votes cast shall be reflected in a 17 certificate of results issued pursuant to section 11-156." 18 SECTION 6. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed 19 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored. 20 SECTION 7. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.

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Report Title: Elections; Ranked Choice Voting

#### Description:

Establishes ranked choice voting for special federal elections and special elections of vacant county council seats. (SD1)

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
