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A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HOMELESSNESS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. Act 209, Session Laws of Hawaii 2018, is amended by amending subsection (b) of section 3 to read as follows:

The governor shall designate executive branch 4 "(b) 5 agencies to develop and implement the ohana zones pilot program, 6 including an agency with specific expertise in construction 7 development and an agency with specific expertise in administering homeless services. The governor, through the 8 **9** · governor's designated agencies, shall determine the number and 10 locations of the ohana zones, which shall be situated on public 11 lands [+] in accordance with subsection (c) or on private lands 12 through a partnership between the State and the owner of the 13 land; provided that the designated agencies shall identify at 14 least three sites on Oahu and one site on each of the islands of 15 Hawaii, Kauai, and Maui."

16 SECTION 2. Act 209, Session Laws of Hawaii 2018, is17 amended by amending section 4 as follows:

By amending subsection (c) to read: 6 The department of human services shall work with the 7 "(C) participating hospital under the emergency department 8 9 homelessness assessment pilot program to collect and analyze 10 data to be included in a report that contains a summary and 11 explanation of the data regarding the efficacy of emergency 12 department intervention by the multidisciplinary team in 13 mitigating the number of unnecessary emergency department visits 14 by patients experiencing homelessness or patients at risk of 15 experiencing homelessness. The report shall contain findings 16 and recommendations, including any proposed legislation, for 17 continuation, modification, or termination of the pilot program. 18 The department of human services shall submit the report to the 19 legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of 20 the regular session of [2019.] 2020."
