A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO SALARY OVERPAYMENTS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

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1	SECTION 1. The legislature finds that salary overpayments
2	have been an ongoing issue throughout many departments and
3	agencies of the State. From November 2016 to October 2017,
4	state departments and agencies in Hawaii overpaid salaries in ar
5	amount exceeding \$415,000 each month. The highest amount of
6	overpayment occurred in November 2016, at \$622,266.14. Greater
7	accountability by state departments and agencies and increased
8	ability to correct overpaid salaries will reduce overpayment
9	waste.
10	The purpose of this Act is to:
11	(1) Require each department to deduct the department's

- (1) Require each department to deduct the department's total salary and wage overpayment from the department's budget request for the following fiscal biennium; and
- 15 (2) Remove the two-year statute of limitations on the
 16 determination and notice of salary or wage
 17 overpayment.

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1 SECTION 2. Chapter 37, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended 2 by adding a new section to be appropriately designated and to 3 read as follows: 4 "§37*-*Salary and wage overpayments deducted from budget requests. Any department that has an outstanding wage or salary 5 6 overpayment balance at the end of a fiscal biennium shall deduct 7 the amount of the balance from the department's budget request 8 in the following biennium." 9 SECTION 3. Section 78-12, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 10 amended by amending subsection (e) to read as follows: 11 "(e) If the indebtedness has occurred as a result of 12 salary or wage overpayment, the disbursing officer shall 13 determine the amount of indebtedness and notify the employee in 14 writing of the indebtedness[; provided that, to be an actionable 15 cause of action, the determination and notice to the employee 16 shall be made within two years from the date of the salary or 17 wage overpayment, and not after]. If the employee contests the 18 disbursing officer's determination of indebtedness, the employee 19 may request a hearing pursuant to chapter 91."

- 1 SECTION 4. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
- 2 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
- 3 begun before its effective date.
- 4 SECTION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 5 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 6 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.
