A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HOUSING.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 46, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended
2	by adding a new section to part VII to be appropriately
3	designated and to read as follows:
4	"§46- Housing elements; housing supply plan. (a) Each
5	county shall prepare a housing supply plan, which shall plan for
6	a projected increase in the housing supply to meet housing
7	demands of all income levels in the State. The housing supply
8	plan shall identify and analyze existing and projected housing
9	needs for all income levels to preserve, improve, and develop
10	housing. The housing supply plan shall identify adequate sites
11	for housing, including rental housing.
12	(b) The housing supply plan shall include an assessment of
13	housing needs and an inventory of resources and constraints
14	relevant to the meeting of housing needs, which shall include:
15	(1) An analysis of population and employment trends and
16	documentation of projections and a quantification of

1		the county's existing and projected housing needs for
2		all income levels;
3	(2)	An analysis and documentation of household
4		characteristics, including level of pay compared to
5		ability to pay, housing characteristics, including
6		overcrowding, and housing stock condition;
7	(3)	An inventory of land suitable and available for
8		residential development, including vacant sites and
9		sites having realistic and demonstrated potential for
10		redevelopment;
11	(4)	An analysis of potential and actual governmental
12		constraints upon the maintenance, improvement, or
13		development of housing, including land use controls,
14		building codes, fees, and any county ordinance that
15		directly impacts the cost and supply of housing
16		development, for all income levels and persons with
17		disabilities. The analysis shall demonstrate the
18		county's effort to remove governmental constraints;
19	(5)	An analysis of potential and actual nongovernmental
20		constraints upon the maintenance, improvement, or
21		development of housing for all income levels,

1		including the availability of financing, the price of
2		land, and the length of time between receiving
3		approval for a housing development and submittal of an
4		application for building permits. The analysis shall
5		demonstrate the county's effort to remove
6		nongovernmental constraints;
7	(6)	An analysis for special housing needs, including
8		housing for the elderly, persons with disabilities,
9		large families, and farmworkers;
10	(7)	An analysis of opportunities for energy conservation
11		with respect to housing development, including energy
12		efficiency measures that encompass the building
13		envelope, its heating and cooling systems, and its
14		electrical systems; and
15	(8)	An analysis of existing assisted housing developments
16		that are eligible to change from low-income housing
17		uses during the next ten years due to termination of
18		subsidy contracts, mortgage prepayment, or expiration
19		of restrictions on use. The analysis shall:
20		(A) Include a listing of each development by project
21		name and address, the type of governmental

1		assistance received, and the earliest possible
2		date existing assisted housing developments will
3		change from low-income housing;
4	(B)	Include an estimated total cost of producing a
5		new rental housing that is comparable in size and
6		rent levels to replace assisted housing
7		developments changing from low-income housing
8		uses; and
9	<u>(C)</u>	Identify public and private nonprofit
10		corporations that have legal and managerial
11		capacity to acquire and manage the assisted
12		housing developments.
13	(c) The	housing supply plan shall include the maximum
14	number of hous	ing units by income levels, including low-income,
15	that can be co	nstructed, rehabilitated, and conserved over a
16	five-year time	period for each county.
17	(d) The	housing supply plan shall identify actions that
18	will be taken	to make sites or land available to develop housing
19	for all income	categories and include how each county plans to
20	acquire, or wh	at means are necessary to acquire, adequate sites
21	to develop hou	sing for all income levels.

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1	(e) Each county shall include the housing supply plan in
2	the respective county's general plan.
3	(f) For purposes of this section:
4	"Assisted housing development" means multi-family rental
5	housing that receives governmental assistance.
6	"Persons with disabilities" has the same meaning as in
7	section 103D-1001."
8	SECTION 2. New statutory material is underscored.
9	SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
