## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HUMAN SERVICES.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that there are many 2 opportunities for securing grants from both public and private 3 sources that could be used to support the health and well-being 4 of individuals, families, and communities in the State. The 5 legislature also finds that applying for grants can be time-6 consuming and complex. These challenges make it difficult for 7 agencies like the department of human services and department of 8 health to successfully apply for and obtain grant moneys, 9 especially when the agencies lack technical expertise in grant 10 writing. Additionally, failure to accurately interpret the 11 details of grant requirements may lead to problematic compliance 12 issues. The legislature believes that the department of human 13 services and department of health would be better positioned to take advantage of grant opportunities if each department had 14 dedicated individuals responsible for the application for and 15 management of grant opportunities and the development of a grant 16 17 program.

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1 2020-2021 to contract the services of a dedicated capture 2 manager for the department of health. 3 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department 4 of health for the purposes of this Act. 5 SECTION 7. There is appropriated out of the general 6 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much 7 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2019-2020 and the 8 same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2020-2021 for the establishment of one full-time equivalent 9 10 (1.00 FTE) temporary exempt position to support the grant 11 development pilot project established by this Act. 12 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department 13 of health for the purposes of this Act. 14 SECTION 8. The appropriations authorized by section 4 and 15 section 7 of this Act shall not lapse at the end of the fiscal 16 biennium for which the appropriation is made; provided that all 17 moneys from the appropriation unencumbered as of June 30, 2022, 18 shall lapse as of that date. 19 SECTION 9. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2019, and

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shall be repealed on June 30, 2022.
