BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. Section 200-10, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
 amended by amending subsection (c) to read as follows:

3 "(c) [The] For mooring use permits at all state small boat
4 <u>harbors</u>, permittee shall pay moorage fees to the department for
5 the use permit that shall be based on but not limited to the use
6 of the vessel, its effect on the harbor, use of facilities, and
7 the cost of administering this mooring program; and,

8 furthermore:

9 Except for commercial maritime activities where there (1) 10 is a tariff established by the department of 11 transportation, moorage fees shall be established by 12 appraisal by a state-licensed appraiser approved by 13 the department [and shall be higher for nonresidents 14 than for residents. The moorage fees shall be set by 15 appraisal categories schedule A and schedule B, to be 16 determined by the department, and may be increased

2		living_index_increase; provided_that:
3		(A) Schedule A shall include existing mooring
4		permittees; and
5		(B) Schedule B shall apply to all new mooring

5	(4)	If a recreational vessel is used as a place of

7		addition to the moorage fee, a liveaboard fee that
8		shall be [calculated at a rate of:
9		(A) \$5.20 a foot of vessel length a month if the
10		permittee is a state resident; and
11		(B) \$7.80 a foot of vessel length a month if the
12		<pre>permittee is a nonresident;</pre>
13		provided that the liveaboard fees established by this
14		paragraph may be increased by the department at the
15		rate of the annual cost-of-living index, but not more
16		than five per cent in any one year, beginning July 1
17		of each year;] established by appraisal by a state-
18		licensed appraiser approved by the department and
19		shall be set at fair market value once per year;
20	(5)	If a vessel is used for commercial purposes from its
21		permitted mooring, the permittee shall pay, in lieu of
