A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO A STATE LOTTERY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The Hawaii Revised Statutes is amended by
2	adding a new chapter to be appropriately designated and to read
3	as follows:
4	"CHAPTER
5	STATE LOTTERY
6	§ -1 Definitions. As used in this chapter, unless the
7	context otherwise requires:
8	"Charitable organization" means any nonprofit organization,
9	including not more than one auxiliary of that organization, that
10	has operated for charitable purposes in this State for at least
11	two years before submitting a license application under this
12	chapter.
13	"Commission" or "lottery commission" means the Hawaii state
14	lottery commission.
15	"Director" means the executive director of the Hawaii state
16	lottery commission.

"Game play-style" means the process or procedure that a 1 2 player shall follow to determine if a lottery ticket or share is 3 a winning ticket or share. 4 "Lottery" or "state lottery" means the lottery created and 5 operated pursuant to this chapter. "Matrix" means the odds of winning a prize and the prize 6 7 payout amounts in a given game. 8 "Person" means an individual, association, corporation, 9 club, trust, estate, society, company, joint stock company, receiver, trustee or referee, any other person acting in a 10 11 fiduciary or representative capacity who is appointed by a 12 court, or any combination of individuals. "Person" includes any 13 department, commission, agency or instrumentality of the State 14 or its political subdivisions. 15 "Premises" means the physical location and address listed on the license of the licensed agent where lottery tickets or 16 17 shares may be sold. 18 S -2 Hawaii state lottery commission; membership; 19 appointment; chairperson; reimbursement of expenses. (a) There 20 is established within the department of accounting and general services for administrative purposes only a Hawaii state lottery 21

3	(1)	One member shall be appointed by the governor;
4	(2)	Two members shall be appointed by the president of the

8	The commi	ssion members shall annually elect one of the members
9	to serve	as chairperson of the commission.
10	(b)	The members shall be as follows:
11	(1)	At least one member of the commission shall have a
12		minimum of five years' experience in law enforcement;
13	(2)	At least one member of the commission shall have a
14		minimum of five years' experience as a certified
15		<pre>public accountant;</pre>
16	(3)	At least one member of the commission shall have a
17		minimum of five years' experience in marketing or
18		advertising, or both; and
19	(4)	At least one member of the commission shall have a
20		minimum of five years' experience in convenience
21		store, minimart, or grocery retailing.

(c) Any member of the commission may be removed from
 office by the governor for cause upon notice and opportunity to
 be heard at a public hearing. The members of the lottery
 commission shall serve without compensation but shall be
 reimbursed for expenses, including travel expenses, necessary
 for the performance of their duties. The terms of the
 commissioners shall be as provided in section 26-34.

8 (d) No commission member shall have a pecuniary interest
9 in any contract or agreement to which the commission is a party.
10 (e) No action of the commission shall be binding unless
11 taken at a meeting with at least three members present who vote
12 in favor of the action in question.

13 § -3 Executive director; appointment. (a) The governor
14 shall appoint an executive director who shall be a person
15 qualified by training and experience to administer the state
16 lottery.

17 (b) Effective December 1, 2019, the director of the
18 commission shall be paid a salary set at eighty-seven per cent
19 of the salary of the director of human resources development.
20 The director shall be exempt from chapters 76 and 89, but shall
21 be a member of the state employees' retirement system and shall

be eligible to receive benefits of any state or federal employee
 benefits program generally applicable to officers and employees
 of the State, including those under chapter 87A.

4 (c) The director shall devote the director's entire time
5 and attention to the administration of the state lottery and
6 shall not be engaged in any other profession or occupation.

7 (d) The director may employ persons not subject to
8 chapters 76 and 78 to perform and execute the functions of the
9 commission.

10 § -4 Commission; director; powers and duties. (a) The 11 commission shall meet with the director not less than once each 12 quarter to make recommendations and set policy, receive reports 13 from the director, and transact other business properly brought 14 before the commission.

(b) The commission shall oversee a state lottery to produce the maximum amount of net revenue consistent with the dignity of the State. To achieve these ends, the commission shall authorize the director to adopt rules in accordance with chapter 91. Rules adopted by the director may include provisions relating to the following:

1 Subject to the approval of the commission, the types (1) of lottery games and the types of game play-styles to 2 be conducted; 3 4 (2) The method of selecting the winning tickets or shares 5 for noncomputerized online games; provided that no method may be used that, in whole or in part, depends 6 7 on the results of a dog race, a horse race, or any 8 sporting event; 9 The manner of payment of prizes to the holders of (3) 10 winning tickets or shares, including providing for 11 payment by the purchase of annuities in the case of 12 prizes payable in installments; provided that the 13 commission staff shall examine claims and may not pay 14 any prize based on altered, stolen, or counterfeit 15 tickets or based on any tickets that fail to meet 16 established validation requirements, including rules 17 stated on the ticket or in the published game rules, 18 and confidential validation tests applied consistently 19 by the commission staff. 7		estimated odds of winning some prize or some cash
8		prize, as appropriate, in a given game shall be
9		printed on each ticket or share;
10	(5)	The licensing of agents to sell tickets or shares;
11		provided that no person who is under eighteen years of
12		age shall be licensed as an agent;
13	(6)	The manner and amount of compensation to be paid to
14		licensed sales agents necessary to provide for the
15		adequate availability of tickets or shares to
16		prospective buyers and for the convenience of the
17		public, including provision for variable compensation
18		based on sales volume; and
19	(7)	Matters necessary or desirable for the efficient and
20		economical operation and administration of the lottery
21		and for the convenience of the purchasers of tickets

6	(6)	Requirements for eligibility for participation in
7		grand drawings or other runoff drawings, including
8		requirements for the submission of evidence of
9		eligibility within a shorter period than that provided
10		for claims by section -21;
11	(7)	Incentive and bonus programs designed to increase
12		sales of lottery tickets or shares and to produce the
13		maximum amount of net revenue for the State; and
14	(8)	The method used for the validation of a ticket, which
15		may be by physical or electronic presentation of a
16		ticket.
17	(d)	Notwithstanding chapter 91 and subsection (b), the
18	director,	subject to the approval of the commission, may
19	establish	a policy, procedure, or practice that relates to an
20	existing	online game or a new online game that is the same type
21	and has t	he same type of game play-style as an online game

currently being conducted by the lottery or may modify an 1 existing rule for an existing online game or a new online game 2 3 that is the same type and has the same type of game play-style as an online game currently being conducted by the lottery, 4 including establishing or modifying the matrix for an online 5 game by giving notice of the establishment or modification at 6 7 least thirty days before the effective date of the establishment or modification. 8 The commission shall maintain and make the following 9 (e) 10 information available for public inspection at its offices 11 during regular business hours: 12 A detailed listing of the estimated number of prizes (1) 13 of each particular denomination expected to be awarded 14 in any instant game currently on sale; 15 (2) After the end of the claim period prescribed by 16 section -21, a listing of the total number of 17 tickets or shares sold and the number of prizes of 18 each particular denomination awarded in each lottery 19 game; and



(3) Definitions of all play symbols and other characters
 used in each lottery game and instructions on how to
 play and how to win each lottery game.

4 (f) Any information that is maintained by the commission
5 that would assist a person in locating or identifying a winning
6 ticket or share or that would otherwise compromise the integrity
7 of any lottery game shall be deemed confidential and shall not
8 be subject to public inspection.

The commission, in addition to other games authorized 9 (q) by this chapter, shall establish two special games for each year 10 to be conducted concurrently with other lottery games authorized 11 under subsection (b). The moneys for prizes, for operating 12 expenses, and for payment into the state general fund, as 13 provided in section -25(b), shall be accounted for separately 14 as nearly as practicable in the lottery commission's general 15 accounting system. The moneys shall be derived from the 16 revenues of the special games, and moneys for prizes shall not 17 be expended from the lottery commission's annual appropriation, 18 except as otherwise provided in section -5(d) and section 19 -25. Moneys saved from the revenues of the special games, by 20

reason of operating efficiencies, shall become other revenue of 1 the lottery commission and revert to the state general fund. 2 The commission, in addition to other games authorized 3 (h) by this chapter, may establish multistate lottery games with the 4 lottery commissions of other states to be conducted concurrently 5 with other lottery games authorized under subsections (b) and 6 7 (g). The moneys for prizes, for operating expenses, and for payment to the state general fund shall be accounted for 8 9 separately as nearly as practicable in the lottery commission's 10 general accounting system. The moneys shall be derived from the 11 revenues of multistate lottery games.

12 The commission, in addition to other games authorized (i) by this chapter, shall establish special instant ticket games 13 14 with play areas protected by paper tabs designated for use by 15 charitable organizations. The moneys for prizes and for 16 operating expenses shall be accounted for separately as nearly 17 as practicable in the commission's general accounting system. 18 Moneys saved from the revenues of the special games, by reason 19 of operating efficiencies, shall become other revenue of the 20 commission and revert to the state general fund.

(j) Except as provided in subsection (d), the commission
 or director shall not establish or operate any online or
 electronic keno game or any game played on the Internet.

4 (k) The director shall print, in a prominent location on
5 each lottery ticket or share, a statement that help is available
6 if a person has a problem with gambling and a toll-free
7 telephone number where problem gambling assistance is available.

8 The director shall require all licensed agents to post a 9 sign with the statement that help is available if a person has a 10 problem with gambling and the toll-free telephone number at the 11 point of sale as prescribed and supplied by the director.

12 -5 Disposition of revenue. (a) Not more than S eighteen and one-half per cent of the total annual revenues 13 accruing from the sale of lottery tickets or shares and from all 14 15 other sources, unless otherwise specified, and not more than 16 thirty-five per cent of the total annual revenues from the sale 17 of special instant ticket games authorized under section -4(i) 18 shall be deposited in the state lottery revolving fund 19 established by section -24 to be expended for the following: 20 (1) The payment of costs incurred in the operation and 21 administration of the lottery, including the expenses



1		of the commission and the costs resulting from any
2		contract or contracts entered into for consulting or
3		operational services;
4	(2)	Independent audits, which shall be performed annually
5		in addition to the audits required by section $-27;$
6	(3)	Incentive programs for lottery sales agents and
7		lottery employees;
8	(4)	Payment of compensation to licensed sales agents
9		necessary to provide for the adequate availability of
10		lottery tickets or services to prospective buyers and
11		for the convenience of the public. Except as
12		otherwise provided in this subsection, compensation of
13		licensed sales agents shall be at least five and one-
14		half per cent but not more than eight per cent of the
15		price of each lottery ticket or share that a retail
16		sales agent sells in instant games and online games,
17	•	less the price of any lottery tickets or shares that
18		are voided;
19	(5)	The payment of reasonable fees to redemption agents as
20		authorized by section -22;

The purchase or lease of lottery equipment, lottery 1 (6) 2 tickets, and materials; and 3 (7) Compensation of a licensed sales agent who is designated as a charitable organization shall be 4 twenty per cent of the price of each lottery ticket 5 from a special instant ticket game authorized under 6 7 section -4(i) and shall be an offset against the sale of the lottery ticket. 8 9 Not less than fifty per cent of the total annual (b) 10 revenues accruing from the sale of lottery tickets or shares 11 shall be deposited in the state lottery prize revolving fund 12 established by section -26 for payment of prizes to the 13 holders of winning lottery tickets or shares or for the purposes 14 provided for in section -21. 15 (c) All other revenues accruing from the sale of lottery

§ -6 Powers and duties of director. In addition to any
 other powers and duties authorized in this chapter, the director
 shall:

Supervise and administer the operation of the lottery 4 (1)5 in accordance with this chapter and the rules adopted under this chapter, subject to the continuous duty to 6 7 take into account the particularly sensitive and responsible nature of the commission's functions; 8 9 (2) Enforce this chapter and the rules adopted under this 10 chapter. The director shall receive allegations of 11 any violations of the laws of this State or rules 12 pertaining to the conduct of the lottery; 13 Pursuant to this chapter and the rules adopted by the (3) 14 commission, license as agents to sell lottery tickets 15 persons that shall best serve the public convenience 16 and promote the sale of lottery tickets or shares; 17 (4) Hire professional, clerical, technical, and 18 administrative personnel as may be necessary to carry 19 out this chapter. The director shall conduct 20 background checks of prospective employees, and, in 21 all employment decisions, shall take into account the

3	(5)	Act as secretary and executive officer of the
4		commission;
5	(6)	Confer regularly as necessary or desirable and not
6		less than once every quarter with the commission on

9		request, all books, records, files, and other
10		information and documents of the commission;
11	(8)	Advise the commission and recommend matters as are
12		necessary and advisable to improve the operation and
13		administration of the lottery;
14	(9)	Suspend or revoke any license issued pursuant to this
15		chapter or the rules adopted pursuant to this chapter,
16		subject to appeal to the commission; and
17	(10)	Within thirty days after receiving an allegation of a
18		violation of the laws of this State or rules
19		pertaining to the conduct of the lottery by a licensed
20		agent and evidence substantiating the allegation,

determine whether the agent has violated the rules or
 if a criminal investigation is warranted.

3 § -7 Monthly reports; annual reports. (a) The director
4 shall submit a monthly report to the commission, the governor,
5 and the legislature. The monthly report shall include the total
6 lottery revenue, prize disbursements, and other expenses for the
7 preceding month.

8 (b) The commission shall submit an annual report to the 9 governor and the legislature not less than twenty days before 10 the convening of each regular session. The annual report shall 11 include a full and complete statement of lottery revenues, prize 12 disbursements, and other expenses for the preceding years, and 13 recommendations, including any proposed legislation, that the 14 commission deems necessary or desirable.

15 § -8 Studies and investigations. (a) The director
16 shall conduct an ongoing study and investigation of the lottery
17 for the following purposes:

18 (1) To ascertain any provisions in this chapter or in its
19 rules through which any abuses in the administration
20 and operation of the lottery or any evasion of this
21 chapter or its rules may arise or be practiced;

To formulate recommendations for changes to this 1 (2) chapter; 2 To guard against the use of this chapter and the rules 3 (3) as a pretext for organized gambling and crime; and 4 To ensure that this chapter and its rules are in a (4) 5 form and are administered to serve the true purposes 6 7 of this chapter. The director shall conduct an ongoing study and (b) 8 9 investigation of the operation and the administration of lottery laws in effect in other states or countries, any literature on 10 the subject that may be published or available, any federal laws 11

12 that may affect the operation of the lottery, and the reaction 13 of residents to existing and potential features of the lottery 14 in order to recommend or effect changes that will tend to serve 15 the purposes of this chapter.

16 S -9 Contracts; limitation; restrictions. (a)
17 Notwithstanding any law to the contrary, the director may:
18 (1) Directly solicit bids and contract for the design and
19 operation of the lottery or the purchase of lottery
20 equipment, lottery tickets, and related materials;



(2) Contract to effectuate the purposes of this chapter
 and the rules adopted pursuant to this chapter; and
 (3) Acquire administrative office facilities and related
 facilities and equipment for the use of the commission
 by lease, purchase, or lease-purchase.

The lottery commission shall be exempt from chapter 6 (b) 103D for procurement relating to the design and operation of the 7 lottery or purchase of lottery equipment, lottery tickets, and 8 related materials. The director shall adopt rules substantially 9 equivalent to the policies and procedures in chapter 103D for 10 procurement relating to the design and operation of the lottery 11 12 or purchases of lottery equipment, lottery tickets, or related materials. All other procurement shall be as specified by 13 chapter 103D. Bids received under this section may be deemed 14 confidential in whole or in part by the director if required to 15 16 protect the sensitive and responsible nature of the commission's 17 functions and the paramount considerations of security and 18 integrity.

(c) Any award made by the director pursuant to this
section becomes effective and binding on the commission unless
it is rejected by the commission at a meeting held within

fourteen calendar days after the award is communicated to the
 members of the commission.

3 (d) A contract awarded or entered into by the director
4 pursuant to this section shall not be assigned by the recipient
5 of the award without specific approval by the director. In all
6 awards of contracts pursuant to this section, the director shall
7 take particular account of the sensitive and responsible nature
8 of the commission's functions and the paramount considerations
9 of security and integrity.

10 S -10 Security operations; powers; peace officer status. 11 The lottery commission shall maintain operations (a) 12 responsible for security. The director shall appoint a security 13 officer to supervise the security operations of the commission. 14 (b) The security operations unit of the lottery commission shall be deemed a law enforcement agency and the supervising 15 16 security officer shall be designated a peace officer. The 17 status as a law enforcement agency or as a peace officer shall 18 be for the limited purpose of receiving investigative 19 information from law enforcement agencies pertaining to 20 investigations of lottery activities.

1 -11 Department of the attorney general; investigation; S 2 authority; payment. The attorney general shall order an investigation into any violation of a state law that pertains to 3 the conduct of the state lottery. The director shall include in 4 5 the commission's overhead expenses and pay, upon certified 6 invoice submitted by the attorney general, any charges for 7 actual expenses as a result of investigations and related law enforcement activities, or for any activity directly or 8 9 indirectly related to the lottery operation. The charges may 10 include costs for personnel, supplies, materials, equipment, and 11 travel within or without the State.

12 § -12 Licenses to sell tickets or shares; fee;
13 conditions; definitions. (a) The director shall not issue a
14 license to operate as a lottery sales agent to any person who
15 engages exclusively in the business of selling lottery tickets
16 or shares. Before issuing a license to operate as a lottery
17 sales agent to any person, the director shall consider factors
18 including:

19 (1) The financial responsibility and security of the
20 person and the nature of the person's business
21 activity;



1	(2)	The person's background and reputation in the
2		community;
3	(3)	The accessibility of the person's place of business or
4		activity to the public;
×5	(4)	The accessibility of existing licensees to serve the
6		public convenience; and
7	(5)	The volume of expected sales.
8	(b)	A person lawfully engaged in nongovernmental business
9	on state	property may be licensed as a lottery sales agent.
10	(c)	The director may establish by rule and collect a fee
11	for a lic	ense issued pursuant to this section.
12	(d)	No license shall be assignable or transferable.
13	(e)	A licensed lottery sales agent or licensed lottery
14	sales age	nt's employee may sell lottery tickets or shares only
15	on the pr	emises stated in the license of the agent.
16	(f)	The director may purchase a blanket bond covering the
17	activitie	s of licensed lottery sales agents.
18	(g)	A licensed lottery sales agent shall display the
19	agent's 1	icense or a copy of the license conspicuously in
20	accordanc	e with the rules adopted by the director.

(h) If a licensed lottery sales agent sells lottery 1 2 tickets or shares on leased premises and all or part of the 3 agent's rental payments are based on the total volume of sales made at the premises, the compensation paid by the lottery 4 commission to the agent for the sale of lottery tickets and 5 shares shall be the amount of the sale for the purposes of 6 determining the agent's rental payments. This subsection shall 7 8 not apply if the lease agreement expressly provides that the total volume of sales made at the premises includes sales of 9 10 lottery tickets or shares.

(i) The commission shall adopt rules to establish penalties for a licensed lottery sales agent who violates section -16 or -17; provided that the penalties for a subsequent violation within any twelve-month period shall be more severe than the penalty for a prior violation.

16 (j) The director shall not require a licensed lottery 17 sales agent, as a condition of securing or continuing to hold a 18 license, to sell lottery tickets or shares to the public or to 19 sell lottery tickets or shares through or by the use of a self-20 service vending machine at the agent's premises.

(k) For the purposes of this section, acts or omissions of
an employee at the premises of a licensed lottery sales agent or
sales of tickets or shares by vending machine in violation of
section -16 or -17 shall be deemed acts or omissions of the
licensed lottery sales agent only at the premises where the
acts, omissions, or sales occurred.

7 § -13 Prosecution; payment of costs. (a) The attorney
8 general and the prosecuting attorneys of the affected county
9 shall have concurrent jurisdiction over any offenses arising out
10 of or in connection with the formation, management, operation,
11 or conduct of the state lottery.

(b) The director shall include, as an expense of the 12 13 commission, all costs incurred by the attorney general or a 14 prosecuting attorney as a result of prosecution of a person for 15 a violation of this chapter or for any violation directly or indirectly related to the state lottery operation. The director 16 17 shall authorize reimbursement of prosecution costs on 18 presentation of a certified invoice signed by the attorney general or a prosecuting attorney. 19

20 (c) As used in this section, "prosecution costs" may
21 include but are not limited to costs for personnel, expenses,

5	The right	of any person to a prize shall not be assignable;
6	provided	that:
7	(1)	Payment of any prize drawn or the remainder of any
8		annuity purchased may be paid to any of the following:
9		(A) The estate of a deceased prize winner;
10		(B) The beneficiary of a deceased prize winner; or
11		(C) A person pursuant to an appropriate judicial

15	(3)	If a voluntary assignment occurs, the remainder of any

6		that are due to the prize winner on or before the
7		date that the assignment takes effect; and
8	(C)	The parties to the assignment pay a fee to the
9		commission to defray the expenses incurred by the
10		commission in processing the assignment. The
11		commission shall determine the amount of the fee.
12		Moneys collected by the commission pursuant to
13		this subparagraph shall be deposited in the state
14		lottery revolving fund established by
15		section -24.
16	(b) On r	eceipt of a court order that meets the
17	requirements o	f subsection (a)(3), the director shall make the
18	voluntary assi	gnment.
19	(c) The	commission and director shall be discharged of all

The contract specifically authorizes participation in 1 (1) the liability setoff program; 2 The attorney general has reviewed the contract and 3 (2) approved the authorization; and 4 (3) The participation in the liability setoff program is 5 limited to debts related to the services the 6 corporation provides for or on behalf of this State. 7 "Debt" means an amount of over \$100 owed to an agency by a 8 person and may include interest, penalties, charges, costs, 9 fees, or any other amount.
