A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO FIREARMS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that Hawaii's penal code
- 2 does not adequately address the reporting of lost or stolen
- 3 firearms. Permits to acquire and registration of firearms are
- 4 required in the State to ensure that firearms remain in the
- 5 possession of individuals who are properly vetted and meet the
- 6 stringent requirements to own or possess firearms. Keeping
- 7 firearms in the hands of authorized owners is vital to the
- 8 public safety of the people of Hawaii. If lost or stolen
- 9 firearms are properly reported, law enforcement can enter the
- 10 information of these lost or stolen firearms into the
- 11 appropriate national and local databases. This information will
- 12 enhance police officer safety when dealing with firearm
- 13 ownership and possession issues in the course of police duties.
- 14 Having access to information on lost or stolen firearms will
- 15 also allow police officers to investigate a report in a timely
- 16 manner, which will assist in the swift seizure of lost or stolen
- 17 weapons and further the goal of public safety.



1 SECTION 2. Chapter 134, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated 3 and to read as follows: 4 "§134- Reporting of lost, stolen, or destroyed firearms. 5 (a) Every person or designee shall report the loss, theft, or 6 destruction of a firearm that the person owns or possesses to 7 the county police department of the county within which the 8 loss, theft, or destruction occurred, within twenty-four hours 9 upon the discovery or such loss, theft, or destruction. Every 10 person reporting the loss, theft, or destruction of a firearm 11 shall report the make, model, and serial number of the firearm, 12 if known by the person, and any additional relevant information **13** required by the county police department taking the report. 14 (b) Upon the receipt of a report of a lost, stolen, or 15 destroyed firearm, the appropriate county police department 16 shall enter into the National Crime Information Center database, **17** to the extent known, the caliber, make, model, manufacturer, and 18 serial number of the firearm and any other distinguishing number 19 or identification mark on the firearm. 20 (c) If a person intentionally or knowingly fails to report 21 to the appropriate county police department the loss, theft, or

2	falsely r	eports the loss, theft, or destruction of that firearm,	
3	the person shall:		
4	(1)	Be guilty of a petty misdemeanor for the first	
5		offense;	
6	(2)	Be guilty of a misdemeanor for the second offense; and	
7	(3)	Be guilty of a misdemeanor for the third offense or	
8		subsequent offense.	
9	<u>(d)</u>	Any person found guilty under subsection (c)(3) shall:	
10	(1)	Have all firearm registrations revoked;	
11	(2)	Surrender all firearms and ammunition to the chief of	
12		police of the appropriate county within seven days of	
13		disqualification; and	
14	(3)	Be prohibited from owning, possessing, or registering	
15		any firearms.	
16	If,	upon conviction, a person fails to voluntarily	
17	surrender	all firearms and ammunition as required by this	
18	subsection, the chief of police may seize all firearms and		
19	ammunitio	n.	
20	(e)	For the purposes of this section, an incident that	
21	applies t	o multiple firearms shall constitute a single offense	

1	if the of	fense pertaining to each firearm arose from the same	
2	occurrence.		
3	<u>(f)</u>	No person shall knowingly make a false report to a	
4	county police department that a firearm has been lost, stolen,		
5	or destroyed.		
6	<u>(g)</u>	A person shall not be in violation of this section if:	
7	(1)	The failure to report is due to an act of God, act of	
8		war, or inability of a county police department to	
9		receive the report;	
10	(2)	The person is hospitalized, in a coma, or is otherwise	
11		seriously physically, or mentally impaired so as to	
12		prevent the person from reporting; or	
13	(3)	The person's designee makes a report if the person is	
14		unable to make the report."	
15	SECTION 3. New statutory material is underscored.		
16	SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
