A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO FIREWORKS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the permit fee for any aerial devices, display fireworks, or articles pyrotechnic 2 3 for a display, which authorizes licensed pyrotechnicians to conduct outdoor and close proximity fireworks for special public 4 5 or private events and theatrical or movie purposes, has remained 6 the same for thirteen years, but the cost to process, review, 7 and approve display permits has increased. The legislature 8 further finds that fees need to keep pace with governmental administrative costs. 9

10 The purpose of this Act is to increase the permit fee for 11 any aerial devices, display fireworks, or articles pyrotechnic 12 for a display from \$110 to \$300.

13 SECTION 2. Section 132D-10, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 14 amended to read as follows:

15 "§132D-10 Permits. A permit shall be required for the 16 purchase and use of:
