# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO TERM LIMITS.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. Section 13D-5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:

3 "[+](a)[+] The term of office of members of the board
4 shall be four years beginning on the day of the general election
5 at which they are elected, or if elected at a primary election,
6 on the day of the general election immediately following the
7 primary election at which they are elected, and ending on the
8 day of the second general election after their election.

9 [Members of the board may be reelected without restriction as to

10 the number of terms.] No person shall be elected to the board

11 for more than two consecutive terms; provided that a person may

12 be reelected after an absence of one full four-year term."

13 SECTION 2. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed14 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

15 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
