A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO ONLINE PLATFORMS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The legislature finds that it is essential to
2	ensure that people can access online platforms freely and fairly
3	without discrimination and without retail bias. Online
4	platforms, including eBay, Amazon Marketplace, Airbnb, and Uber,
5	connect sellers and service providers to consumers in an online
6	marketplace. Many tech companies have vertically integrated
7	their businesses, including their online platforms, which can
8	result in the online platform giving preferential treatment to
9	its own products through searches or traffic management.
10	The purpose of this Act is to ensure that online platforms
11	operating in the State provide fair access to the platform by:
12	(1) Requiring online platforms to provide
13	nondiscriminatory access to the platform; and
14	(2) Prohibiting preferential treatment of the platform's
15	own vertically integrated business lines.

1	SECTION 2. The Hawaii Revised Statutes is amended by		
2	adding a new chapter to be appropriately designated and to read		
3	as follows:		
4	"CHAPTER

6	§ -1 Definitions. As used in this chapter, unless the		
7	context otherwise requires:		
8	"Edge provider" means any individual or entity that		
9	provides any content, application, product, or service over the		
10	online platform.		
11	"End user" means any individual or entity that uses an		
12	online platform.		
13	"Online platform" means an online marketplace that places		
14	one party in touch with another, such as buyers and sellers.		
15	The outline platform may be entirely self-contained, or it may		
16	allow third-party applications to connect via the platform's		
17	programming interface.		
18	"Platform provider" means any individual or entity that		
19	provides access to any online platform offering goods and		

services within the State.

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"Preferential treatment" means the management of an online 1 2 platform to directly or indirectly favor some products or 3 services over others, including through the use of techniques 4 such as discriminatory search processes, traffic shaping, 5 prioritization, resource reservation, or other forms of 6 preferential traffic management, either: 7 (1) In exchange for consideration, monetary or otherwise, 8 from a third party; or 9 (2) To benefit an affiliated entity. **10** "Reasonable platform management" means a practice that has 11 a primarily technical platform management justification, but 12 does not include other business practices. A platform 13 management practice is reasonable if it is primarily used for 14 and tailored to achieving a legitimate platform management 15 purpose, taking into account the particular platform 16 architecture and technology. **17** Online platform access; disclosure; protections. A platform provider shall publicly disclose accurate 18 information regarding the platform management practices, 19 20 performance, and commercial terms of its online platform

4	(b)	A platform provider shall provide nondiscriminatory
5	access to	the online platform and shall not:
6	(1)	Block lawful content, applications, products,
7		services, or nonharmful devices, subject to reasonable
8		platform management;
9	(2)	Impair or degrade lawful online platform traffic on
10		the basis of content, application, product, or
11		service, or use of a nonharmful device, subject to
12		reasonable platform management;
13	(3)	Engage in preferential treatment; or
14	(4)	Unreasonably interfere with or unreasonably
15		disadvantage:
16		(A) End users' ability to select, access, and use the
17		online platform or the lawful internet content,
18		applications, products, services, or devices of
19		their choice; or

1	(B) Edge providers' ability to make lawful content,
2	applications, products, services, or devices
3	available to end users;
4	provided that the prohibition on preferential treatment pursuant
5	to paragraph (3) of this subsection may be permitted if a
6	petitioner demonstrates that the practice would provide some
7	significant public interest benefit and would not harm the open
8	nature of the platform in the State."
9	SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.

Report Title:

Online Platform Access; Protections; Platform Neutrality

Description:

Requires a provider of an online platform offering goods and services in the State to provide nondiscriminatory access to the platform and be transparent with platform management practices, performance, and commercial terms of its platform. Prohibits preferential treatment of the platform's own vertically integrated business lines.

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
