A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EDUCATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that article X,
- 2 section 1, of the Constitution of the State of Hawaii requires
- 3 the State to provide a system of public education. Compared to
- 4 other states, Hawaii is unique because the State, rather than a
- 5 county or local level jurisdiction, is responsible for public
- 6 education. As a result, funding for public education in Hawaii
- 7 is primarily sourced from the general fund of the State.
- 8 The legislature further finds that adequate funding is
- 9 crucial to providing each of Hawaii's children with a high-
- 10 quality educational opportunity. Yet, some studies found that
- 11 education funding in Hawaii may be lagging in comparison to
- 12 districts of similar size and cost of living. For example,
- 13 according to an analysis of real property tax in Hawaii
- 14 performed by the department of business, economic development,
- 15 and tourism in 2017, Hawaii's education expenditures, as a share
- 16 of combined state and local government expenditures, is 27.3 per
- 17 cent and ranks as the lowest in the nation.



The legislature additionally finds that underfunding public 1 schools could undermine the State's goal of providing a quality 2 education to all of Hawaii's children. Insufficient education 3 funding results in higher class sizes, a lack of adequate 4 classroom supplies, elimination of arts and career and technical 5 education courses, budget cuts for special education and English 6 7 language learner programs, and an increasing number of vacant teacher positions. To prepare children to meet the social and 8 economic demands of the twenty-first century, it is necessary to 9 understand the amount of funding necessary to support student 10 11 learning. The purpose of this Act is to require the department of 12 education to contract with a third party consultant that 13 specializes in school finance and has previous experience in 14 conducting studies of public education systems in multiple 15 16 states to perform a study on the adequacy of education funding 17 in Hawaii. The department of education shall contract SECTION 2. (a) 18 with a third party consultant that specializes in school finance 19 20 to perform a study of the adequacy of education funding in Hawaii. The third party consultant shall have previous 21

4	(1)	Employ the evidence-based method with input from
5		educational stakeholders and professionals to evaluate
6		the adequacy of school funding;
7	(2)	Identify variables most closely associated with a
8		high-quality education and estimate the amount of
9		additional funding needed to provide all public school
10		students in Hawaii with an equal educational
11		opportunity;
12	(3)	Compare Hawaii teacher salaries with teacher salaries
13		in school districts of similar size and cost of living
14		to determine compensation characteristics that impact
15		the department of education's ability to recruit and
16		retain effective teachers;
17	(4)	Assess the equity of funding between schools
18		throughout the Hawaii public school system, such as
19		with a horizontal equity study; and
20	(5)	Review school funding studies and equity-based
21		analyses performed in other states, including Using

8	(c) The department of education shall submit a copy of the	
9	study, along with a report of its findings and recommendations,	
10	including any proposed legislation, to the legislature no later	
11	than twenty days prior to the convening of the regular session	
12	of 2021.	
13	SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general	
14	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$200,000 or so much	
15	thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2019-2020 for the	
16	department of education to contract with a third party	
17	consultant that specializes in school finance to perform a study	
18	of the adequacy of education funding in Hawaii.	
19	The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of	
20	education for the purposes of this Act.	

1 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval;

2 provided that section 3 shall take effect on July 1, 2019.
