### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO APPROPRIATIONS.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. This Act is recommended by the governor for
- 2 immediate passage in accordance with section 9 of article VII of
- 3 the Constitution of the State of Hawaii.
- 4 SECTION 2. The legislature finds that the virus known as
- 5 "SARS-CoV-2" causes a disease named "coronavirus disease 2019"
- 6 (COVID-19), that was first detected in Wuhan City, Hubei
- 7 Province, China, in January 2020. There is now an international
- 8 outbreak of this respiratory disease. COVID-19 has now been
- 9 detected in many locations internationally, including in the
- 10 United States. In February 2020, the department of health was
- 11 notified of a Japanese national who developed severe symptoms,
- 12 sought medical care, and was tested and diagnosed with COVID-19
- 13 upon returning home to Japan after a trip to Hawaii that
- 14 involved travel to both Maui and Oahu.
- On January 30, 2020, the International Health Regulations
- 16 Emergency Committee of the World Health Organization declared
- 17 the outbreak a "public health emergency of international



- 1 concern." On January 31, 2020, United States Health and Human
- 2 Services Secretary Alex M. Azar II declared a public health
- 3 emergency for the United States to aid the nation's healthcare
- 4 community in responding to COVID-19.
- 5 Due to the fast-moving and unpredictable spread of
- 6 COVID-19, as well as general public concern, the legislature
- 7 finds it timely and appropriate to allocate resources to the
- 8 department of health in support of activities to detect,
- 9 contain, mitigate, and respond to COVID-19, including:
- 10 (1) Syndromic surveillance to monitor potential COVID-19
- encounters and supplement traditional case-finding
- 12 activities:
- 13 (2) Enhanced communication strategies that provide
- 14 general, high-risk, and vulnerable populations with
- actionable information for self-protection, including
- 16 identification of symptoms and clear guidance for
- 17 seeking treatment;
- 18 (3) Intensive source control in the event that local
- 19 epicenters in Hawaii are identified, including
- isolation of patients and persons testing positive for
- 21 COVID-19, contact tracing and health monitoring,

1	(6) Transportation, storage, distribution, and
2	administration of vaccines and other treatments for
3	populations at risk of COVID-19 infection.
4	Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to make an
5	emergency appropriation to the department of health for the
6	ourposes of COVID-19 response measures in the State.
7	SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
8	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$6,000,000 or so much
9	thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2019-2020 to be used
10	for coronavirus disease 2019, or COVID-19, response; provided
11	that the funds appropriated shall be allocated as follows:
12	(1) \$800,000 for contracted services to provide multi-
13	media public education and awareness campaigns;
14	(2) \$200,000 for quarantine and self-monitoring, including
15	quarantine and self-monitoring of persons:
16	(A) Who are not residents of the State or who are
17	homeless;
18	(B) Who are not included in the federal quarantine
19	mandate; or
20	(C) With confirmed diagnoses of COVID-19 who are
21	hospitalized and discharged prior to the

1			conclusion of a fourteen-day quarantine period
2			but who require options for self-monitoring;
3	(3)	\$1,3	00,000 for laboratory testing, equipment, and
4		supp	lies, including four additional full-time
5		equi	valent (4.0 FTE) department of health staff

7	(4)	\$2,5	00,000 for disease outbreak surveillance and

9		(A)	Personal protective equipment for disease

19			investigation, logistics management, data-entry,
20			and other related activities.

- 2 of that date.
- 3 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
