A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO APPROPRIATIONS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. This Act is recommended by the governor for
 immediate passage in accordance with section 9 of article VII of
 the Constitution of the State of Hawaii.

4 SECTION 2. The legislature finds that the virus known as 5 "SARS-CoV-2" causes a disease named "coronavirus disease 2019" 6 (COVID-19), that was first detected in Wuhan City, Hubei 7 Province, China, in January 2020. There is now an international 8 outbreak of this respiratory disease. COVID-19 has now been 9 detected in many locations internationally, including in the 10 United States. In February 2020, the department of health was 11 notified of a Japanese national who developed severe symptoms, 12 sought medical care, and was tested and diagnosed with COVID-19 13 upon returning home to Japan after a trip to Hawaii that 14 involved travel to both Maui and Oahu.

15 On January 30, 2020, the International Health Regulations 16 Emergency Committee of the World Health Organization declared 17 the outbreak a "public health emergency of international

concern." On January 31, 2020, United States Health and Human
 Services Secretary Alex M. Azar II declared a public health
 emergency for the United States to aid the nation's healthcare
 community in responding to COVID-19.

5 Due to the fast-moving and unpredictable spread of 6 COVID-19, as well as general public concern, the legislature 7 finds it timely and appropriate to allocate resources to the 8 department of health in support of activities to detect, 9 contain, mitigate, and respond to COVID-19, including:

10 (1) Syndromic surveillance to monitor potential COVID-19
11 encounters and supplement traditional case-finding
12 activities;

13 (2) Enhanced communication strategies that provide
14 general, high-risk, and vulnerable populations with
15 actionable information for self-protection, including
16 identification of symptoms and clear guidance for
17 seeking treatment;

18 (3) Intensive source control in the event that local
19 epicenters in Hawaii are identified, including
20 isolation of patients and persons testing positive for
21 COVID-19, contact tracing and health monitoring,
