A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS FOR PRESIDENT THEODORE ROOSEVELT HIGH SCHOOL.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that, founded in 1930 and 2 situated in Makiki on the island of Oahu, President Theodore 3 Roosevelt high school has grown to serve an enrollment of more 4 than one thousand four hundred students. The school's existing 5 gymnasium and music building were constructed over fifty years 6 ago and do not meet current department of education standards.

7 The legislature provided funding for plans and design for a 8 master plan for a new gymnasium, new music building, and 9 additional on-site parking in Act 106, Session Laws of Hawaii 10 2012. The final master plan, DOE Job No. Q22000-13, dated 11 December 23, 2014, presented the preferred master plan for: 12 A new gymnasium over a one-level parking structure at (1)13 the site of the existing gymnasium; and 14 (2) A new two-story music building and repurposing of the existing music building.
