A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PRESCRIPTION DRUGS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The legislature finds that several laws to
2	address the nationwide opioid epidemic were passed during the
3	2018 legislative session, including laws allowing pharmacists t
4	prescribe and dispense opioid antagonists to patients who are a
5	risk of an opioid overdose; requiring health care providers in
6	the workers' compensation system to adopt and maintain policies
7	for informed consent to opioid therapy in circumstances that
8	carry elevated risk of dependency; limiting concurrent opioid
9	and benzodiazepine prescriptions in the workers' compensation
10	system; and requiring packaging on opioid drugs to include a
11	label warning of the risks of overdose and addiction.
12	However, the legislature finds that additional measures
13	need to be enacted in order to address the safe disposal of
14	unused or unwanted opioid drugs. Allowing pharmacies to accept
15	prescription drugs for disposal provides a convenient,
16	accessible method for Hawaii residents to dispose of opioid

drugs that are no longer needed.

2	(1)	Authorize certain pharmacies to collect prescription		
3		drugs for disposal via secured collection receptacles		
4		or mail-back programs; and		
5	(2)	Prohibit pharmacies from redispensing or returning		
6		prescription drugs that have been returned for		
7		disposal.		
8	SECT	TON 2. Chapter 461, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
9	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated			
10	and to read as follows:			
11	"§461- Return for disposal of unused, remaining, or			
12	expired d	rugs; pharmacy options. (a) No pharmacy shall accept		
13	the retur	n of any prescription drug unless:		
14	(1)	The pharmacy is collecting the prescription drug for		
15		disposal only; and		
16	(2)	The pharmacy is registered with the United States Drug		
17		Enforcement Administration as an authorized collector		
18		pursuant to title 21 Code of Federal Regulations		
19		section 1317.40.		
20	(b)	No prescription drug returned to the pharmacy for		
21	disposal	shall be redispensed or returned for cash or credit.		

1	(c) <i>I</i>	Any pharmacy accepting prescription drugs for disposal
2	shall use t	the following methods:

Report Title:

Pharmacies; Prescription Drugs; Return for Disposal

Description:

Authorizes pharmacies to accept the return of any prescription drug for disposal via collection receptacles or mail-back programs; prohibits pharmacies from redispensing returned prescription drugs or from accepting returned prescription drugs in exchange for cash or credit; requires the pharmacist-in-charge to ensure that only authorized reverse distributors acquire prescription drugs collected via collection receptacles or mail-back programs.
