# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO AGRICULTURE.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. Section 147-7, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended to read as follows:

3 Inspection and classification of agricultural "§147-7 4 commodities; fees. (a) The department may contract with the 5 United States Department of Agriculture for obtaining the 6 services of a supervising inspector employed by the federal 7 department and the establishment of a cooperative inspection 8 service with the United States government. The department, or 9 the supervising inspector with the approval of the department, may designate any competent employee or agent of the department 10 11 as an inspector to inspect or classify agricultural commodities 12 in accordance with rules of the department, and at the time and 13 places designated by the supervising inspector or the 14 department.

(b) The inspectors shall be authorized to inspect or
classify agricultural commodities at the request of persons
having a financial interest in the commodities, or as mandated

by subsection (d), and to ascertain and certify to the persons
 the grade, classification, quality, condition, or origin of them
 and other pertinent facts.

4 The department may fix, assess, and collect or cause (C)5 to be collected fees for the services when they are performed by 6 employees of the department. The fees shall be on a uniform, 7 per pound basis and in an amount reasonably necessary to cover 8 the cost of inspection and the administration of this part; 9 provided that the department may prescribe a reasonable charge 10 for traveling expenses and extraordinary services when the 11 performance of the services involves unusual cost in their 12 performance. No fee shall be charged for an inspection unless 13 the inspection was requested by a person having a financial 14 interest in the inspected commodity [-] or the inspection was 15 mandated by subsection (d).

(d) All Hawaii grown green coffee beans shall be inspected
and certified by the department for grade and origin if shipped
out of the district of origin; provided that this subsection
shall not apply to shipments of one hundred pounds or less.
[-(d)-] (e) The department may adopt rules establishing the
requirements, procedures, restrictions, and other criteria
