A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO SUSTAINABILITY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that not only is climate
- 2 change real, but it is the overriding challenge of the twenty-
- 3 first century and one of the priority issues of the State.
- 4 Climate change poses immediate and long-term threats to the
- 5 State's economy, sustainability, security, and way of life.
- 6 The legislature recognized in Act 8, Special Session Laws
- 7 of Hawaii 2005, that "many quality-of-life issues, including
- 8 water quality, air quality, land use, energy, and ocean
- 9 resources, are important to the people of Hawaii and should be
- 10 the focus for planning Hawaii's future" and created the Hawaii
- 11 2050 sustainability task force and the Hawaii 2050
- 12 sustainability plan to "coordinate the actions needed to sustain
- 13 a growing and vibrant economy, while maintaining a high quality
- 14 of life for all residents and visitors."
- 15 The legislature recognized in Act 181, Session Laws of
- 16 Hawaii 2011, that "[t] he creation of the Hawaii 2050
- 17 sustainability plan comes as the State faces a growing number of

- 1 pressing issues, including the steady deterioration of public
- 2 infrastructure, the lack of affordable housing, a continued
- 3 reliance on a service-based economy, the vulnerability of Hawaii
- 4 in a volatile global energy market, possible interruptions in
- 5 travel and to critical food supplies, threats to fragile island
- 6 ecosystems, ever-increasing numbers of residents, and an
- 7 increasing number of visitors over the long-term." These issues
- 8 all raise questions about the long-term limits of growth in the
- 9 State and highlight the need to begin planning and acting to
- 10 assure Hawaii's sustainable future.
- 11 The purpose of this Act is to establish a stronger policy
- 12 framework for Hawaii's sustainability efforts, by incorporating
- 13 sustainability coordination and planning into the duties and
- 14 responsibilities of the office of planning by establishing a
- 15 statewide sustainability division within the office of planning
- 16 to ensure long-term planning, coordination, and implementation
- 17 of Hawaii's sustainability goals and policies. This statewide
- 18 sustainability division will serve as an independent, permanent,
- 19 multi-sectoral, and interdepartmental coordinating entity for
- 20 Hawaii's government agencies to work on cross-agency resiliency,

- 1 sustainability, and climate action planning issues and
- 2 strategies for Hawaii's future.
- 3 SECTION 2. The Hawaii Revised Statutes is amended by
- 4 adding a new chapter to be appropriately designated and to read
- 5 as follows:
- 6 "CHAPTER
- 7 SUSTAINABILITY
- 8 -1 Purpose. The purpose of this chapter is to promote
- 9 and organize the State's sustainability goals, policies, and
- 10 guidelines through a statewide sustainability division to
- 11 protect the State's economy, environment, and way of life.
- 12 § -2 Definition. As used in this chapter:
- "Sustainability" means using, developing, and protecting
- 14 resources in a manner that enables people to meet current needs
- 15 and adapt and become resilient to Hawaii's changing climate, and
- 16 provides that future generations can also meet future needs,
- 17 from the joint perspective of environmental, economic, and
- 18 socially equitable objectives.
- 19 § -3 Findings and goals regarding sustainability. In
- 20 addition to the priority guidelines and principles promoting
- 21 sustainability set forth in section 226-108, the following

3	(1)	The	statewide sustainability division of the office of
4		plan	ning shall assist state agencies to achieve the
5		foll	owing objectives:
6		(A)	Encourage state purchases be made in a manner
7			that serves the broad, long-term financial
8			interests of the State, including ensuring that
9			environmental, economic, and societal
10			improvements are made to enhance environmental,
11			economic, and societal well-being;
12		(B)	Promote investments in facilities, equipment, and
13			durable goods to reflect the highest feasible
14			efficiency and lowest life-cycle costs;
15		(C)	Promote investments and expenditures to improve
16			in the efficient use of energy, water, food
17			security, and other resources;
18		(D) [']	Encourage state operations in diverse locations,
19			including rural and economically distressed
20			communities;

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1	(E)	Encourage state operations and purchases to help
2		maintain vital and active urban communities,
3		including downtown areas;
4	(F)	Promote state purchases to support opportunities
5		for economically distressed communities and
6		historically underemployed individuals;
7	(G)	Support state operations to reflect partnerships
8		with communities and businesses;
9	(H)	Advocate for state operations to help reduce
10		adverse effects on native habitats and species
11		and help restore ecological processes;
12	(I)	Improve state operations using methods that
13		significantly increase the efficient use of
14		energy, water, food security, and other
15		resources;
16	(J)	Encourage state operations and purchases to
17		reflect the efficient use and reuse of resources
18		and reduction of contaminants released into the
19		environment; and
20	(K)	Coordinate and promote the United Nations
21		sustainable development goals;

1	(2)	The	statewide sustainability division of the office of	
2		plan	planning shall assist state agencies to support	
3		sust	sustainable communities, and assist and encourage	
4		loca	l communities to achieve the following objectives:	
5		(A)	Resilient local economies that provide diverse	
6			economic opportunities for all residents;	
7		(B)	Workers supported by lifelong education that will	
8			ensure a globally competitive workforce;	
9		(C)	An independent and productive citizenry;	
10		(D)	Youth supported by strong families and	
11			communities;	
12		(E)	Urban communities, including downtown areas, that	
13			are active and vital;	
14		(F)	Development that wisely and efficiently uses	
15			infrastructure, investments, and natural	
16			resources;	
17		(G)	Affordable housing available for residents in	
18			community centers;	
19		(H)	Healthy urban and rural watersheds, including	
20			habitats for fish and wildlife;	
21		(I)	Clean and sufficient water for all uses; and	

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1		(J) Efficient use and reuse of resources and
2		minimization of harmful emissions into the
3		environment; and
4	(3)	The statewide sustainability division of the office of
5		planning shall intensify efforts to increase the
6		economic stability of communities that are designated
7		as economically distressed.
8	S	-4 Statewide sustainability division. (a) The
9	statewide	sustainability division is established within the
10	office of	planning. The sustainability division shall have the
11	following	duties:
12	(1)	Develop, organize, and promote policies and programs
13		that assist in the meeting of sustainability goals
14		established in this chapter, including Hawaii's
15		numerous sustainability and climate policies and
16		goals, and the priority guidelines and principles to
17		promote sustainability set forth in section 226-108;
18	(2)	Identify, evaluate, and make recommendations regarding
19		proposed legislation, regulatory changes, or policy
20		modifications to the governor, the legislature,
21		government agencies, private entities, and other

1	d	odies for the purpose of encouraging activities that	
2	b	est sustain, protect, and enhance the quality of the	
3	е	nvironment, economy, and community for the present

5	(3) D	evelop and promote proposals that jointly and

9	SECTIO	N 3. Section 225M-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is	
10	amended to	read as follows:	
11	"§225M	-1 Purpose. The purpose of this chapter is to	
12	establish a	n office of planning to assist the governor and the	
13	director of	business, economic development, and tourism in	
14	maintaining	an overall framework to guide the development of the	
15	State through a continuous process of comprehensive, long-range		
16	and strateg	ic planning to meet the physical, economic, and	
17	social need	s of Hawaii's people, and provide for the wise use of	
18	Hawaii's re	sources in a coordinated, efficient, and economical	
19	manner, inc	luding the conservation of those natural,	
20	environment	al, recreational, scenic, historic, and other limited	

1	and irrep	laceable resources [which] that are required for futur
2	generatio	ns.
3	The	establishment of an office of planning in the
4	departmen	t of business, economic development, and tourism, for
5	administr	ative purposes, is intended to:
6	(1)	Fix responsibility and accountability to successfully
7		carry out statewide planning programs, policies, and
8		priorities;
9	(2)	Improve the efficiency and effectiveness of the
10		operations of the executive branch;
11	(3)	Ensure comprehensive planning and coordination to
12		enhance the quality of life of the people of
13		Hawaii[-]; and
14	(4)	Coordinate the implementation of sustainability
15		principles and policies that increase economic
16		development while developing and protecting resources
17		in a manner that enables individuals to meet their
18		current needs and ensure that future generations can
19		also meet their needs, from the joint perspective of
20		environmental, economic, and community objectives,

1	through collaboration and cooperation between the
2	public and private sectors."
3	SECTION 4. Section 226-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
4	amended by amending the definition of "sustainability" to read
5	as follows:
6	""Sustainability" [means achieving the following:
7	(1) Respect of the culture, character, beauty, and history
8	of the State's island communities;
9	(2) Striking a balance between economic, social,
10	community, and environmental priorities; and
11	(3) Meeting the needs of the present without compromising
12	the ability of future generations to meet their own
13	needs.] shall have the same meaning as in section
14	-2. ^{II}
15	SECTION 5. There is appropriated out of the general
16	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$250,000 or so much
17	thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2019-2020 and the
18	same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year
19	2020-2021 for the establishment of and implementation of the
20	statewide sustainability division.

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- 1 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the office of
- 2 planning for the purposes of this Act.
- 3 SECTION 6. There is appropriated out of the general
- 4 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$270,000 or so much
- 5 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2019-2020 and the
- 6 same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year
- 7 2020-2021 for the establishment of one full-time equivalent
- 8 (1.00 FTE) secretary III position, two full-time equivalent
- 9 (2.00 FTE) planner IV positions, and two full-time equivalent
- 10 (2.00 FTE) planner V positions to support the statewide
- 11 sustainability division.
- 12 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the office of
- 13 planning for the purposes of this Act.
- 14 SECTION 7. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 15 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 16 SECTION 8. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2019.
