### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO VACCINATIONS.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the United States
- 2 Department of Health and Human Services Advisory Committee on
- 3 Immunization Practices (ACIP) is a group of medical and public
- 4 health experts who develop vaccine recommendations for
- 5 consideration and approval by the federal Centers for Disease
- 6 Control and Prevention (CDC). The ACIP also publishes the
- 7 "General Best Practice Guidelines for Immunization" on how to
- 8 administer the list of ACIP recommended and CDC approved
- 9 vaccines.
- 10 The legislature also finds that under existing law, the
- 11 director of health, in consultation with the state
- 12 epidemiologist, may adopt, amend, or appeal the immunization
- 13 recommendations of the ACIP, including interim recommendations,
- 14 as they apply to all ACIP recommended vaccines.
- 15 However, the ACIP vaccine recommendations and
- 16 administration quidelines are not requirements or blanket state
- 17 mandates for public school attendance, as neither the ACIP nor



- 1 the CDC has regulatory power to mandate vaccinations or
- 2 immunizations in Hawai'i. With the exception of Hawai'i and
- 3 Rhode Island, every state in the nation establishes its own list
- 4 of vaccine requirements for school eligibility via the
- 5 legislative process, rather than through administrative rules.
- 6 Vaccination is a medical intervention that may present
- 7 certain risks or serious complications in some individuals.
- 8 Because of this risk potential, the decision to add any vaccine
- 9 requirement for public school attendance should remain subject
- 10 to legislative oversight. Furthermore, a current department of
- 11 health rules proposal to mandate all ACIP federal vaccine
- 12 recommendations and guidelines for public school children has
- 13 raised some public concerns. In light of these concerns, the
- 14 establishment of one mandatory set of vaccinations for all
- 15 public school children in Hawai'i may not be the most prudent
- 16 course of action at this time. The legislature notes that as of
- 17 2019, Hawai'i's public school vaccination and immunization
- 18 requirements are already in full alignment with the majority of
- 19 states across the country.
- The purpose of this Act is to remove the authority of the
- 21 department of health to adopt, amend, or appeal vaccination and



immunization requirements for school, post- secondary school, 1 2 and child care facility attendance in the State of Hawai'i. 3 SECTION 2. Section 302A-1154, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 4 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows: 5 "(a) No child shall attend any school in the State unless 6 the child presents to the appropriate school official 7 documentation satisfactory to the department of health that the 8 child has received immunizations against communicable diseases 9 as required by [the department of health.] section 325-32." 10 SECTION 3. Section 302A-1155, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 11 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows: 12 "(a) A child may attend school provisionally upon 13 submitting written documentation from a licensed physician, 14 physician assistant, advanced practice registered nurse, or an 15 authorized representative of the department of health stating **16** that the child is in the process of receiving the required 17 immunizations. Further documentation showing that the required 18 immunizations have been completed shall be submitted to the 19 appropriate school official no later than three months after the 20 child first attends the school. If all of the required 21 immunizations cannot be completed within three months due to the

1 length of the recommended minimum intervals between doses of a 2 particular vaccine [required by the department of health], 3 provisional attendance may be extended so long as the child's 4 parent or guardian provides documentation that appointments for 5 required immunizations have been made and that progress toward 6 completing the immunizations continues in accordance with the 7 requirements of [the department of health.] section 325-32." 8 SECTION 4. Section 302A-1162, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 9 amended to read as follows: 10 "§302A-1162 Rules. (a) The department of health shall 11 adopt rules under chapter 91 relating to [immunization,] **12** physical examination, and tuberculin testing under sections 13 302A-1154 to 302A-1163. [Immunizations required, and the manner 14 and frequency of their administration, shall conform with recognized standard medical practices. The list of diseases and 15 16 minimum requirements for protection under sections 302A 1154 to 17 302A 1163 may be revised whenever the department of health deems 18 it necessary for the protection of public health.] 19 The department shall establish by rule standards for 20 documentation of compliance with school health requirements 21 under sections 302A-1154 through 302A-1163.

1	(c) [The department may adopt, amend, or repeal rules
2	pursuant to chapter 91 to establish a list of specific vaccines
3	that are available or may become available. Notwithstanding the
4	notice, public hearing, and comment requirements of chapter 91
5	and the provisions of chapter 201M, the director of health, in
6	consultation with the state epidemiologist, may adopt, amend, or
7	repeal as rules, the immunization recommendations of the United
8	States Department of Health and Human Services, Advisory
9	Committee on Immunization Practices, including interim
10	recommendations, as they apply to the list of specific vaccines,
11	if any, described in this subsection. The department shall make
12	the adoption, amendment, or repeal of rules regarding United
13	States Department of Health and Human Services, Advisory
14	Committee on Immunization Practices immunization recommendations
15	known to the public by:
16	(1) Giving public notice of the substance of the proposed
17	rules at least once statewide; and
18	(2) Posting the full text of the proposed rulemaking
19	action on the Internet as provided in section 91 2.6.
20	The rules, when adopted, amended, or repealed pursuant to
21	chapter 91 as modified by this section, shall have the force and

effect of law. The department may defer the effective date of 2 adopted, amended, or repealed rules to allow sufficient time to 3 ensure compliance with the new, amended, or repealed rules." 4 SECTION 5. Section 302A-1163, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 5 amended to read as follows: "[+] §302A-1163[+] Enforcement. The department of health 6 7 shall administer and enforce the immunization and tuberculin 8 test requirements under sections 302A-1154 to 302A-1163[-] and 9 325-32." 10 SECTION 6. Section 325-32, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 11 amended to read as follows: 12 Immunization against infectious diseases. (a) 13 [The department of health may adopt rules requiring and 14 governing immunization] Except as provided in section 325-34, 15 students shall be immunized against [typhoid fever,] pertussis (whooping cough), diphtheria, tetanus, poliomyelitis, measles, 16 17 mumps, hepatitis B, rubella, haemophilus influenzae type B, and 18 [any other communicable disease, if a suitable immunizing agent 19 is available for the disease and a need for immunization against 20 it exists within the State.] varicella. The manner and 21 frequency of administration shall conform with recognized

1 standard medical practices. The department may also provide 2 vaccines and other immunizing agents to private and public 3 health care providers for administration to the general public. 4 The department may [adopt, amend, or repeal rules 5 pursuant to chapter 91 to establish] publish a list of specific 6 vaccines that are [available or may become available. 7 Notwithstanding the notice, public hearing, and comment 8 requirements of chapter 91 and the provisions of chapter 201M, 9 the director of health, in consultation with the state 10 epidemiologist, may adopt, amend, or repeal as rules, the 11 immunization recommendations of the United States Department of 12 Health and Human Services, Advisory Committee on Immunization 13 Practices, including interim recommendations, as they apply to 14 the list of specific vaccines, if any, described in this 15 subsection. The department shall make the adoption, amendment, 16 or repeal of rules regarding United States Department of Health 17 and Human Services, Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices 18 immunization recommendations known to the public by: 19 (1) Giving public notice of the substance of the proposed 20 rules at least once statewide; and

1 (2) Posting the full text of the proposed rulemaking 2 action on the Internet as provided in section 91 2.6. 3 The rules, when adopted or amended pursuant to chapter 91 as 4 modified by this section, shall have the force and effect of 5 law. The department may defer the effective date of adopted, amended, or repealed rules to allow sufficient time to ensure 6 7 compliance with the new, amended, or repealed rules.] 8 recommended for use according to the recommendations adopted by 9 the Centers of Disease Control and published in the Morbidity 10 and Mortality Weekly Report. The department may also publish 11 recommendations based on the United States Department of Health 12 and Human Services, Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices 13 General Best Practice Guidelines for Immunization for the manner 14 and frequency of vaccine administration." 15 SECTION 7. Section 325-33, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 16 amended to read as follows: 17 "§325-33 Performance of vaccination and immunization. 18 Vaccinations or immunizations required of any person under this 19 chapter shall be performed by duly licensed physicians or 20 paramedical personnel under their direction, advanced practice 21 registered nurses, physician assistants, or by authorized

- 1 representatives of the department of health. A record of the
- 2 immunization shall be maintained by the physician, physician
- 3 assistant, or advanced practice registered nurse and shall be
- 4 available to the department of education for school entry
- 5 requirements and the department of health[-]; provided that the
- 6 department of education or the department of health shall secure
- 7 the informed written consent of the person or the person's
- 8 parent or guardian prior to the release of the immunization
- 9 record."
- 10 SECTION 8. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 11 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 12 SECTION 9. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
