A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HUNTING.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 183D, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
2	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated		
3	and to read as follows:		
4	" <u>§183D-</u> Hawaii apprentice hunting license program;		
5	established. (a) There is established the Hawaii apprentice		
6	hunting license program. The program shall provide participants		
7	with the opportunity to learn whether the participant is		
8	interested in obtaining a hunting license pursuant to section		
9	183D-22. A Hawaii apprentice hunting license shall not be a		
10	prerequisite to obtain a hunting license under section 183D-22.		
11	(b) A Hawaii apprentice hunting license shall be issued to		
12	a person who:		
13	(1) Is ten years of age or older; and		
14	(2) Will be mentored by an adult who is twenty-one years		
15	of age or older who holds a valid hunting license		
16	under this part.

1	(c) The holder of a Hawaii apprentice hunting license		
2	shall carry the license on the holder's person at all times		
3	while engaged in hunting. The holder shall also be accompanied		
4	by and under supervision of the mentor required pursuant to		
5	subsection (b)(2). While in the field, there shall not be more		
6	than two Hawaii apprentice hunting license holders under the		
7	mentorship and supervision of any single mentor. For Hawaii		
8	apprentice hunting license holders engaged in hunting with the		
9	use of firearms, there shall be no more than two firearms in the		
10	field between the mentor and the supervised apprentice or		
11	apprentices.		
12	(d) If the holder of a Hawaii apprentice hunting license		
13	desires to obtain a hunting license, the holder shall meet the		
14	requirements pursuant to section 183D-22.		
15	(e) A Hawaii apprentice hunting license shall be valid for		
16	the duration of a current hunting license year when applied for;		
17	provided that the license shall be renewable for one additional		
18	license year.		
19	(f) The license fee for a Hawaii apprentice hunting		
20	license shall be:		



1	(1) \$10 for any person who has resided in the State for		
2	one year or longer, or who is a member of the armed		
3	forces of the United States on active duty; and		
4	(2) \$95 for all other persons."		
5	SECTION 2. Section 183D-21, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
6	amended to read as follows:		
7	"§183D-21 Hunting licenses required. No person shall		
8	hunt, pursue, kill, or take any game bird or mammal without		
9	first procuring a hunting license[;] or a valid Hawaii		
10	apprentice hunting license pursuant to section 183D- ; provided		
11	that section 183D-32 to the contrary notwithstanding, no license		
12	shall be required of persons who may be authorized in writing by		
13	the board to destroy game birds or game mammals injurious to		
14	forest growth or agriculture, or that constitute a nuisance or a		
15	health hazard."		
16	SECTION 3. Section 183D-22, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
17	amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:		
18	"(a) A hunting license shall be issued to a person by an		
19	agent of the department upon:		
20	(1) Written application in the form prescribed by the		
21	department;

1	(2)	Payment of a hunting license fee or any other hunting
2		related fee the board may require as provided in this
3		chapter; except that payment of the fee shall be
4		waived for any employee of the department who is
5		required to have a license to carry out duties of the
6		department; and
7	(3)	Showing of a valid Hawaii hunter education certificate
8		or written exemption issued under section 183D-28 or
9	:	upon showing proof of completion of an approved hunter
10		education course described in section 183D-
11		28(b)(2)[-]; provided that the holder of a valid
12		Hawaii apprentice hunting license shall be exempt from
13		showing proof of completion of an approved hunter
14		education course.
15	The appli	cation shall require a statement under oath of the
16	applicant	's name, address, domicile or residence, length of
17	residence	in the State, age, race, height, weight, and color of
18	hair and o	eyes[+]; provided that for an applicant who holds a
19	<u>Hawaii ap</u>	prentice hunting license and is under the age of
20	eighteen,	the application shall require the legal signatures of

1 the applicant's parents or legal quardian in person at any of 2 the department's division of forestry and wildlife offices." 3 SECTION 4. Section 183D-28, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 4 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows: 5 "(a) The department shall establish a hunter education 6 program to provide instruction in hunter safety, principles of 7 conservation, and sportsmanship. Upon successful completion of the program, the department shall issue to the graduate a hunter 8 education certificate which shall be valid for the life of the 9 10 person. This certification shall be rescinded by judicial action upon the conviction of a wildlife and/or firearms 11 12 violation. No person shall be eligible for a hunting license 13 unless the person possesses a valid hunter education certificate, valid Hawaii apprentice hunting license, or meets 14 15 the requirements for exemption provided in subsection (b)(2), and is either: 16 17 (1) Born after December 31, 1971; or 18 (2) Born before January 1, 1972, and has never been issued 19 a hunting license in the State." 20 SECTION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed 21 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
