A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO ELECTIONS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Section 11-334, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows: 3 "(a) The candidate and treasurer of the candidate committee of each candidate whose name will appear on the ballot 4 5 shall file preliminary, final, and supplemental reports as 6 follows: 7 (1)The filing dates for preliminary reports are: 8 (A) [Thirty] Sixty calendar days before a primary, 9 initial special, or initial nonpartisan election; 10 [Ten] Thirty calendar days before a primary, (B) 11 initial special, or initial nonpartisan election; 12 and 13 [Ten] Thirty calendar days before a general, (C) 14 subsequent special, or subsequent nonpartisan election; provided that this preliminary report 15 16 does not need to be filed by a candidate who is **17** unsuccessful in a primary, initial special, or

1		initial nonpartisan election, or a candidate who
2		is elected to office in the primary, initial
3		special, or initial nonpartisan election.
4		The preliminary report filed by the date required
5		under subparagraph (A) shall be current through [June
6		30, May 31, and all other preliminary reports shall
7		be current through the fifth calendar day before the
8		filing deadline of those other preliminary reports;
9	(2)	The filing date for the final primary report is twenty
10		calendar days after a primary, initial special, or
11		initial nonpartisan election. The report shall be
12		current through the day of the applicable election;
13	(3)	The filing date for the final election period report
14		is thirty calendar days after a general, subsequent,
15		subsequent special, or subsequent nonpartisan
16		election. The report shall be current through the day
17		of the applicable election. The final election period
18		report shall be filed by a candidate who is
19		unsuccessful in a primary, initial special, or initial
20		nonpartisan election or a candidate who is elected to
21		office in the primary, initial special, or initial

1	nonpartisan election; provided that a candidate who is
2	elected and is to be sworn into office prior to thirty
3	calendar days after a general, subsequent, subsequent
4	special, or subsequent nonpartisan election in which
5	the candidate was elected, shall file the final
6	election period report three business days before the
7	date the candidate is to be sworn into office; and
8	(4) The filing dates for supplemental reports are:
9	(A) January 31 annually; and
10	(B) July 31 after an election year.
11	The report shall be current through December 31 for
12	the report filed on January 31 and current through
13	June 30 for the report filed on July 31."
14	SECTION 2. Section 11-336, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
15	amended as follows:
16	1. By amending subsection (a) to read:
17	"(a) The filing dates for preliminary reports are $[\div]$ as

19	(1) Sixty calendar days prior to a primary, initial
20	special, or initial nonpartisan election;

                The filing dates for supplemental reports are:
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          (1) January 31[+] annually; and
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          (2) July 31 after an election year.
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    The report shall be current through December 31 for the report
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    filed on January 31 and current through June 30 for the report
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    filed on July 31."
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          SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
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    and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
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SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.

Report Title:

Elections; Candidate Committee Reports; Noncandidate Committee Reports; Filing Dates

Description:

Specifies that the filing date for candidate committee preliminary reports is thirty days, rather than ten days, before a general, subsequent special, or subsequent nonpartisan election. Specifies that the filing date for candidate committee preliminary reports is sixty and then thirty days, rather than thirty days and then ten days, before a primary, initial special, or initial nonpartisan election and that the report filed sixty days before the election shall be current through May 31. Amends the filing due dates for noncandidate committee reports to correspond with the due dates for candidate committee reports.
