A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CLIMATE CHANGE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. Greenhouse gas emissions are a leading cause of
global warming and climate change. The legislature has passed
numerous measures over the last decade to address climate
change. Among them, Act 32, Session Laws of Hawaii 2017,
commits Hawaii to systematically reduce greenhouse gas emissions
and improve resiliency to climate change in alignment with the
principles and goals of the Paris Climate Agreement.

8 The legislature finds that Hawaii has increasing exposure 9 to climate change related risks and events. However, the 10 islands also have environmental resources such as forests, 11 wetlands, coral reefs, and other natural infrastructure that -12 if healthy, well-managed, and functioning - can help reduce 13 emissions as well as mitigate the risks and related loss and damages from climate change. As such, it is important to invest 14 15 in nature-based solutions to climate change.

The commission shall identify vulnerable people, 16 (h) communities, industries, ecosystems, and the potential economic 17 18 ramifications for climate change related impacts. 19 The commission shall identify existing climate change (i) 20 mitigation and adaptation efforts at the federal, state, and

15	change im	pacts, mitigation, and adaptation.	
16	(k)	The commission shall assess and make recommendations	
17	related t	o insurance, reinsurance and other risk transfer	
18	products or market mechanisms that incentivize public and		
19	private investment in nature-based solutions that reduce carbor

4 SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the general revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$50,000 or so much 5 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2019-2020 and the 6 7 same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 8 2020-2021 for the Hawaii climate change mitigation and 9 adaptation commission to identify and prioritize nature-based 10 solutions for climate change and identify insurance and risk transfer mechanisms to incentivize investment in such solutions. 11 12 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department 13 of land and natural resources for the purposes of this Act. SECTION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed 14 15 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored. SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2019. 16
