A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that less than a quarter
- 2 of Hawaii high schools that offer advanced placement coursework
- 3 offer advanced placement computer science classes. The
- 4 legislature also finds that there is a shortage of applicants
- 5 for current computing jobs. For Hawaii companies to compete
- 6 nationally and globally, Hawaii students need access to
- 7 comprehensive, grade appropriate computer science classes.
- 8 The purpose of this Act is to appropriate funds for the
- 9 department of education to award scholarships to students
- 10 working toward teaching degrees at state accredited institutions
- 11 of higher education who successfully complete one course in
- 12 computer science.
- 13 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general
- 14 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much
- 15 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2019-2020 and the
- 16 same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year
- 17 2020-2021 for a scholarship program, to be established and



- 1 administered by the department of education, which shall
- 2 distribute \$1,000 awards to students working toward teaching
- 3 degrees at state accredited institutions of higher education who
- 4 successfully complete one course in computer science.
- 5 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
- 6 of education for the purposes of this Act.
- 7 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2052.
