SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE LEGISLATIVE REFERENCE BUREAU TO CONDUCT A STUDY OF THE IMPACT OF THE MILITARY ON HAWAII'S ECONOMY.

1	WHEREAS, the military's presence in Hawaii has a
2	significant impact on the State's economy; and
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4	WHEREAS, according to the United States Department of
5	Defense, over forty-two thousand active duty military personnel
6	are assigned to Hawaii as of September 2019; and
7	are apprended to manari ap of peptember 2019, and
8	WHEREAS, the Department of Education estimates that Hawaii
9	hosts over three hundred thousand military personnel and their
10	families, who contribute to consumer spending and use the
11	State's education, housing, and natural resources; and
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13	WHEREAS, according to the Department of Education,
14	approximately fourteen thousand military dependents attend
15	public schools, which represents roughly eight percent of the
16	State's total student enrollment; and
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18	WHEREAS, military personnel stationed in Hawaii often
19	require additional housing near military installments; and
20	require additional nousing hear military installments, and
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21	WHEREAS, consistent with the holding in <u>Clarence Ching</u> , et
22	al. v. Suzanne Case, et al., 145 Hawaii 148 (2019), military
23	operations on leased public trust lands require environmental
24	oversight by the State, which in turn requires the appropriation
25	of additional public funds; and
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27	WHEREAS, understanding the amount of revenue generated by
28	military spending in Hawaii, the cost of environmental oversight
29	obligations for lands leased for military use, and the extent of
30	State support afforded to military personnel will help the

Legislature in crafting fiscal policy that safeguards the public 1 trust and advances the common good; now, therefore, 2 3 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirtieth Legislature 4 of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2020, the House of 5 Representatives concurring, that the Legislative Reference 6 Bureau is requested to conduct a study of the impact of the 7 8 military on Hawaii's economy; and 9 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the study is requested to 10 include an evaluation of the military's impact on: 11 12 Funding for public education, including the extent to (1)13 which federal impact aid reimbursements received by 14 the Department of Education fulfill the expenditures 15 required to meet the educational needs of federally 16 connected students; 17 18 (2) Hawaii's housing supply, including the availability 19 and cost of housing for sale and rent in communities 20 located near military installations; 21 22 Land use and environmental considerations, including 23 (3) the cost to the State of monitoring, inspecting, and 24 restoring lands leased by the military to preserve 25 trust lands; and 26 27 Consumer spending by military personnel and their (4)28 families; and 29 30 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Legislative Reference 31 Bureau is requested to submit a report of its findings and 32 recommendations, including any proposed legislation, to the 33 Legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of 34 the Regular Session of 2021; and 35 36 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 37 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Director of the 38 Legislative Reference Bureau; Director of Business, Economic 39 Development, and Tourism; Chairperson of the Board of Land and 40 Natural Resources; Superintendent of Education; and Chief 41 Executive Officer of the Office of Hawaiian Affairs. 42
