#### SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION TO ESTABLISH A FREE APPLICATION FOR FEDERAL STUDENT AID WORKING GROUP TO DEVELOP AND IMPLEMENT A PLAN TO MAKE COMPLETION OF A FREE APPLICATION FOR FEDERAL STUDENT AID A STATEWIDE GRADUATION REQUIREMENT BEGINNING IN THE 2022-2023 ACADEMIC YEAR.

WHEREAS, the Free Application for Federal Student Aid is a 1 2 form completed by current and prospective post-secondary 3 education students seeking undergraduate or graduate education in the United States to determine eligibility for federal 4 5 financial aid; and 6 7 WHEREAS, federal financial aid options include need-based 8 aid such as federal Pell Grants, as well as unsubsidized 9 Stafford loans that may be available to students regardless of income or other circumstances; and 10 11 12 WHEREAS, in 2018, certain eligible Hawaii students could have claimed \$10,000,000 in federal Pell Grant moneys, had they 13 14 completed a Free Application for Federal Student Aid, but this federal financial aid instead went unclaimed; and 15 16 17 WHEREAS, students who do not complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid may rely instead on private student 18 loans that often have high interest rates and lack the consumer 19 protections included with federal student loans; and 20 21 22 WHEREAS, completion of the Free Application for Federal 23 Student Aid is also the leading indicator of college enrollment, and there is ample evidence that increased financial aid results 24 in positive outcomes, including college completion; and 25 26 27 WHEREAS, in 2016, in response to more than fifty percent of Louisiana high school seniors not completing the necessary 28 29 paperwork, the State of Louisiana began requiring completion of



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the Free Application for Federal Student Aid as a prerequisite 1 2 for graduation; and 3 4 WHEREAS, as of 2019, Louisiana is ranked first in the 5 nation for completion of the Free Application for Federal Student Aid among high school seniors, having an eighty-two 6 7 percent completion rate; and 8 9 WHEREAS, in recent years, Hawaii's Free Application for Federal Student Aid completion rate has remained close to sixty 10 percent; and 11 12 WHEREAS, the Department of Education has set a goal to have 13 ninety percent of Hawaii high school seniors complete the Free 14 Application for Federal Student Aid in the 2019-2020 academic 15 year; and 16 17 18 WHEREAS, increasing completion of the Free Application for Federal Student Aid will benefit Hawaii students and families, 19 and may result in long-term benefit to the State through 20 increased educational achievement and a corresponding increase 21 in economic growth and stability; now, therefore, 22 23 24 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirtieth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2020, the House of 25 Representatives concurring, that the Department of Education is 26 requested to establish a Free Application for Federal Student 27 28 Aid Working Group to develop and implement a plan to make 29 completion of a Free Application for Federal Student Aid a 30 statewide graduation requirement beginning in the 2022-2023 31 academic year; and 32 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Education is 33 requested to include in this plan an option to waive the 34 requirement, provided that any waiver require an acknowledgement 35 36 of the purpose of and opportunities provided through completion 37 of a Free Application for Federal Student Aid; and 38 39 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Free Application for Federal Student Aid Working Group comprise the following: 40



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1 (1)The Chair of the Senate Committee on Education, or the 2 Chair's designee, who is requested to serve as co-3 chair of the Working Group; 4 5 (2) The Chair of the House of Representatives Committee on 6 Lower and Higher Education, or the Chair's designee, 7 who is requested to serve as co-chair of the Working 8 Group; 9 (3) 10 The Superintendent of Education, or the Superintendent's designee; 11 12 (4) 13 The Chairperson of the Board of Education, or the 14 Chairperson's designee; 15 (5) 16 The President of the University of Hawaii, or the President's designee; 17 18 A representative from the University of Hawaii 19 (6) 20 Community College System, to be selected by the University of Hawaii Vice President for Community 21 22 Colleges; 23 24 (7) The Executive Director of Hawaii P-20 Partnerships for 25 Education, or the Executive Director's designee; 26 A Department of Education complex area superintendent, 27 (8) 28 to be selected by the Superintendent of Education; 29 30 (9) A Department of Education principal, to be selected by the Superintendent of Education; 31 32 33 (10) A Department of Education school counselor, to be 34 selected by the Superintendent of Education; 35 36 (11)A representative of the nonprofit sector, to be 37 invited by the Speaker of the House of Representatives 38 to be a member of the Working Group; 39 40 (12)A representative of the Hawaii Association for College Admission Counseling, to be invited by the President 41 42 of the Senate to be a member of the Working Group;

32 33 34 35 36 37 38	(4)	Strategies to better support students through the college application process, including providing necessary guidance for students to enroll in college and continue with success once the Free Application for Federal Student Aid is completed;
39 40 41 42	(5)	Procedures to protect family privacy, particularly for undocumented immigrant families, and to support schools to provide hardship waivers for students having unresponsive parents; and



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(6) Any other issue deemed necessary by the Working Group; and

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BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Working Group is requested to submit to the Legislature, the Superintendent of Education, and each complex area superintendent, a report of its findings and recommendations, including any proposed legislation, no later than twenty days prior to the convening of the Regular Session of 2021; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 11 12 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Governor, President of the Senate, Speaker of the House of Representatives, 13 Superintendent of Education, Chairperson of the Board of 14 15 Education, President of the University of Hawaii, Vice President for Community Colleges of the University of Hawaii, Executive 16 Director of the Hawaii P-20 Partnerships for Education, and 17 President of the Hawaii Association for College Admission 18 19 Counseling.
