SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

URGING THE DIVISION OF FORESTRY AND WILDLIFE TO COMPLETE THE HABITAT CONSERVATION PLAN FOR PU'U WA'AWA'A AND PU'U ANAHULU BY 2022.

1 WHEREAS, section 183D-2(12), Hawaii Revised Statutes, provides that the Department of Land and Natural Resources shall 2 3 "[p]reserve, protect, and promote public hunting"; and 4 5 WHEREAS, the Department of Land and Natural Resources, Division of Forestry and Wildlife, is responsible for managing 6 and protecting native ecosystems as well as providing hunting 7 opportunities to the community; and 8 9 WHEREAS, the Division of Forestry and Wildlife is 10 responsible for game management at Pu'u Wa'awa'a and Pu'u Anahulu, 11 the two most popular game mammal hunting areas on Hawaii island; 12 13 and 14 15 WHEREAS, the Division of Forestry and Wildlife has been working on a habitat conservation plan for Pu'u Wa'awa'a and Pu'u 16 Anahulu; and 17 18 19 WHEREAS, the habitat conservation plan covers about one hundred and four thousand acres (project area); and 20 21 22 WHEREAS, the project area contains sixteen endangered 23 species: fifteen species of plant and one insect; and 24 25 WHEREAS, the intent of the habitat conservation plan, in addition to protecting and mitigating impacts to endangered 26 species, is to also provide for sustained yield game management 27 activities designed to preserve, protect, and promote hunting 28 within the project area; and 29 30

WHEREAS, sustained yield game management ensures a viable 1 2 game species population through science, monitoring, and regulation as a public resource; and 3 4 5 WHEREAS, deregulated public hunting should not be 6 considered a sustained yield game management plan at Pu'u Wa'awa'a 7 and Pu'u Anahulu; and 8 9 WHEREAS, ensuring the existence of game animals population 10 through science, monitoring, and regulation as a public resource is beneficial to preventing certain threats to native and 11 12 endangered species in the project areas; and 13 14 WHEREAS, the habitat conservation plan with its broad base 15 intent of protecting and mitigating impacts to endangered species and to provide for sustained yield game management has 16 been an ongoing project since 2003 when surveys were conducted 17 18 across the project area; and 19 WHEREAS, since 2003, there has been a great deal of work 20 expended on the habitat conservation plan; and 21 22 WHEREAS, approximately \$3,593,900 has already been spent on 23 24 habitat conservation plan activities; now, therefore, 25 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirtieth Legislature 26 of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2020, the House of 27 Representatives concurring, that the Division of Forestry and 28 29 Wildlife is urged to complete the habitat conservation plan for Pu'u Wa'awa'a and Pu'u Anahulu by 2022; and 30 31 32 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a certified copy of this Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Chairperson of the 33 Board of Land and Natural Resources. 34 35 36 OFFERED BY Maine Maye 37
