SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING APPROVAL FROM THE FEDERAL HIGHWAY ADMINISTRATION FOR A PROPOSED LOW-INCOME AND WORKFORCE HOUSING PROJECT LOCATED WITHIN THE FOOTPRINT OF FEDERALLY-FUNDED INTERSTATE HIGHWAY, F.A.P. NO. I-H1-1(13), EWA OF HUGH STREET IN PEARL CITY AND URGING THE GOVERNOR TO USE OHANA ZONE PILOT PROGRAM FUNDS FOR THE PROJECT.

WHEREAS, in 2018, over 6,500 individuals experienced 1 homelessness in Hawaii, according to Partners in Care's annual 2 point in time survey; and 3 4 5 WHEREAS, while market rental rates in Hawaii are among the highest in the nation and overall cost of living is the highest, 6 average household income in the State is among the lowest; and 7 8 9 WHEREAS, Hawaii's income to expense gap has consistently widened over the past ten years as rents, particularly in 10 11 Honolulu, have consistently risen faster than both wages and inflation; and 12 13 WHEREAS, the State's stock of affordable housing stock is 14 insufficient to meet demand, especially for the lowest income 15 households, for which affordable housing is available to less 16 than one-third of households; and 17 18 WHEREAS, Housing First is a nationally recognized best 19 practice proven to be the most effective and efficient approach 20 to help people experiencing chronic homelessness get and stay 21 22 off the streets by immediately moving them from the streets or homeless shelters into their own apartments; and 23 24 25 WHEREAS, many county, state, and private interests are working together to find innovative solutions to homelessness 26

and Hawaii's housing crisis that adhere to the Housing First 1 model; and 2 3 4 WHEREAS, one such initiative is a planned transitional 5 housing pilot project on Oahu to be placed on land subject to the jurisdiction of the Federal Highway Administration, use of 6 7 which requires one or more permits or approvals from the Federal 8 Highway Administration; and 9 10 WHEREAS, one location subject to the jurisdiction of the Federal Highway Administration that has been identified as a 11 potential location for a low-income and workforce housing 12 project is the property located beneath the H-1 viaduct, 13 Interstate Highway, F.A.P. No. I-H1-1(13), Ewa of Hugh Street in 14 15 Pearl City; and 16 17 WHEREAS, as part of the planning and preparation for the 18 housing pilot project, the project developers will soon begin 19 submitting preliminary applications for federal approval; now, 20 therefore. 21 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirtieth Legislature 22 of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2020, the House of 23 Representatives concurring, that the Federal Highway 24 25 Administration is requested to approve a proposed low-income and workforce housing project located within the footprint of 26 federally-funded interstate highway, F.A.P. No. I-H1-1(13), Ewa 27 of Hugh Street in Pearl City; and 28 29 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Federal Highway 30 Administration is requested to timely process applications for 31 permits and approvals necessary for the development of the 32 proposed low-income and workforce housing project on land 33 subject to Federal Highway Administration jurisdiction and 34 35 timely approve applications that meet eligibility criteria; and 36 37 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Governor is urged to use part of the Ohana Zones Pilot Program funds appropriated in Act 38 39 209, Session Laws of Hawaii 2018, to support the development of 40 the proposed low-income and workforce housing project under the H-1 viaduct; and 41
