SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

URGING THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION TO BROADEN THE CONTENT OF THE SOCIAL SCIENCE CURRICULUM TO INCLUDE VARIOUS PRINCIPLES OF DIVERSITY.

WHEREAS, teaching principles of diversity prepares students 1 to be global citizens by exposing them to different cultures and 2 3 social groups; and 4 5 WHEREAS, exposure to principles of diversity allows students to be prepared to work in settings and situations with 6 various groups of people; and 7 8 9 WHEREAS, studies show that students feel safer in and out of school when they receive an education that includes a variety 10 of diverse perspectives; and 11 12 WHEREAS, learning about different social, ethnic, and 13 religious cultures allows students to become comfortable with 14 cultural differences across social groups and comfortable with 15 16 their own identity; and 17 18 WHEREAS, the Department of Education has made great strides to include principles of diversity in its social science 19 curriculum to more accurately reflect the roles of women and 20 different racial and ethnic groups in society and throughout 21 history; and 22 23 24 WHEREAS, being educated about diversity increases cultural competence and reduces discriminatory stereotyping; and 25 26 27 WHEREAS, our community as a whole will greatly benefit from enhancing our cultural competence to include gender, sexual 28 orientation, and religion; and 29 30 31 WHEREAS, the Department of Education's anchor standard 32 SS.9-12.5.1, highlights the importance for students to identify

local, regional, and global problems and issues using 1 interdisciplinary lenses; now, therefore, 2 3 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirtieth Legislature 4 of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2020, the House of 5 Representatives concurring, that the Department of Education is 6 urged to include social issues and historical perspectives of 7 gender identity, sexual orientation, and religious practices in 8 its social science curriculum; and 9 10 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 11 12 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Governor, Chairperson of the Board of Education, and Superintendent of 13 Education. 14 15 16 17
