SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

DESIGNATING APRIL AS TREE AWARENESS MONTH IN THE STATE OF HAWAII.

1 2 3	WHEREAS, trees have been identified as an important tool to combat global climate change, reducing society's carbon footprint and helping communities become healthier, and

5	WHEREAS, trees contribute to the environment by cleaning
6	the air, removing odors and pollutant gases, and filtering
7	particulates out of the air, removing and storing carbon while
8	releasing oxygen back into the air; and
9	
10	WHEREAS, trees cool heat-absorbing streets and buildings up
11	to ten degrees Fahrenheit by releasing water vapor into the air
12	through their leaves, encouraging residents to walk thereby
13	improving their health, and contributing to more vital
14	communities and reducing UV-B exposure by almost fifty percent,
15	thus providing protection to children from exposure to ultra
16	violet rays on school campuses and playgrounds where children
17	spend hours outdoors; and

19	WHEREAS, well documented studies confirm the positive
20	effects of trees on health and productivity, including patients
21	recovering faster from surgery, lowering blood pressure, office
22	workers performing better with views of trees out their windows,
23	as well as students having higher test scores and graduation
24	rates with trees outside their school windows, aiding in
25	concentration by reducing mental fatigue; and
26	
27	WHEREAS, trees in our island state are a crucial part of
28	sustainable living as well as important to our agricultural
29	economy through harvested fruit and wood, providing green jobs
30	and opportunities for small business; and
31	
32	WHEREAS, the United States Department of Agriculture
33	reported street trees to be "the single largest benefit" to

property values, well planted trees can raise property values, 1 and that trees planted along streets, sidewalks, and parking 2 lots can help to absorb heat energy, dust, mask concrete walls, 3 and unsightly views, muffle sound from freeways and create eye 4 soothing canopy of green, slow traffic, give civic pride and 5 identity to neighborhoods; and 6 7 WHEREAS, in our tourism based economy, the beauty of the 8 9 surroundings is vitally important; and 10 WHEREAS, studies show that the more trees and landscaping a 11 business district has, the more business will flow in. Trees 12 not only contribute beauty but cool areas where tourists walk, 13 in addition, hiking, the now popular forest bathing; and 14 15 WHEREAS, state and community organizations have endeavored 16 to foster knowledge and awareness of trees, Trees for Honolulu's 17 Future, Healthy Climate Communities, Smart Trees Pacific and 18 Outdoor Circle, Dr. Camilo Mora of the Mora Lab Carbon 19 Neutrality Project of the University of Hawaii and the 20 Department of Land and Natural Resources which states "trees 21 literally hold our island state together, helping define our 22 island sense of place, that special connection between our 23 diverse cultures and the environment, the land and its people"; 24 25 and 26 WHEREAS, according to Dr. Camilo Mora of Mora Lab of the 27 Geography and Environment Department at the University of Hawaii 28 heads the Carbon Neutrality Project. Arbor Day is one day to 29 help raise awareness of trees and a month would raise much 30 greater awareness and adequately recognize the multitude of 31 32 benefits and importance trees have, particularly an island state which depends on more heavily on sustainability and tourism; and 33 34 WHEREAS, the public should be encouraged to learn more 35 about the value of trees and designating April as Tree Awareness 36 Month would be an appropriate way to honor trees and recognize 37 the multitude of benefits of trees for while also providing 38 community building, educational and economic opportunities 39 throughout the previously listed events; now, therefore, 40 41
