## SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE HAWAII EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT AGENCY TO CONDUCT DISASTER PREPAREDNESS OUTREACH AND EDUCATION THROUGHOUT THE STATE.

WHEREAS, according to the National Aeronautics and Space 1 Administration and European satellite data, the rate of global 2 3 sea level rise has been accelerating in recent decades; and 4 WHEREAS, in 2019, a study published in Proceedings of the 5 National Academy of Sciences projected that in a low carbon 6 7 emission scenario, global sea levels would rise thirty centimeters by the year 2050 and sixty-nine centimeters by the 8 year 2100, with these calculations increasing to thirty-four 9 centimeters by the year 2050 and one hundred eleven centimeters 10 by the year 2100 in a high emission scenario; and 11 12 WHEREAS, according to the Hawaii Climate Change Mitigation 13 and Adaptation Commission, global sea levels could rise more 14 15 than three feet by the year 2100; and 16 WHEREAS, over the next thirty to seventy years, the Hawaii 17 Climate Change Mitigation and Adaptation Commission estimates 18 that six thousand five hundred structures and nineteen thousand 19 20 eight hundred people statewide will be exposed to chronic flooding; and 21 22 WHEREAS, approximately thirty-eight miles of roadways and 23 five hundred fifty cultural sites may be chronically flooded 24 because of sea level rise, according to the Hawaii Climate 25 26 Change Mitigation and Adaptation Commission; and 27 28 WHEREAS, flooding of land and structures located in sea 29 level rise exposure areas could result in an estimated \$19

billion economic loss to the State, according to the Hawaii 1 2 Climate Change Mitigation and Adaptation Commission; and 3 4 WHEREAS, Hawaii has a 25,800-acre statewide sea level rise exposure area, one-third of which is designated for urban use; 5 and 6 7 8 WHEREAS, preparing communities for the impact of sea level rise is essential to protecting Hawaii's economy and 9 safeguarding public health; now, therefore, 10 11 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirtieth Legislature 12 of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2020, the House of 13 Representatives concurring, that the Hawaii Emergency Management 14 Agency is requested to conduct disaster preparedness outreach 15 and education throughout the State; and 16 17 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that disaster preparedness outreach 18 and education conducted by the Hawaii Emergency Management 19 Agency include information about enhancing community resilience 20 and building awareness of hazard mitigation, preparedness, 21 response, and recovery; and 22 23 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 24 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Governor and 25 Director of the Hawaii Emergency Management Agency. 26 27 28 29 OFFERED BY: Digor ER
