## SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

## EXPRESSING SUPPORT FOR PHASE ONE OF THE UNITED STATES - CHINA TRADE AGREEMENT.

WHEREAS, phase one of the United States - China trade 1 agreement was signed by President Donald J. Trump and Vice 2 Premiere Liu He of the People's Republic of China on 3 4 January 15, 2020; and 5 WHEREAS, the trade agreement focuses on various trade 6 7 sectors across both countries, including intellectual property rights, trade in food and agricultural products, and financial 8 services; and 9 10 WHEREAS, in return for the United States reducing tariffs 11 on Chinese imports, China pledged to purchase roughly 12 \$200,000,000,000 in goods and services from the United States 13 over the next two years, which include \$80,000,000,000 in 14 manufactured goods, \$35,000,000,000 in services, \$32,000,000,000 15 in agriculture products, and \$50,000,000,000 in energy exports; 16 17 and 18 WHEREAS, the trade war between the United States and China 19 has had negative impacts on residents and businesses throughout 20 21 the State; and 22 WHEREAS, data from the United States Census Bureau, 23 confirms that there has been a decline in exports from the 24 25 United States to China in recent years as a result of the trade war; and 26 27 WHEREAS, the trade agreement will improve economic 28 relations between the two largest economies in the world; and 29 30 WHEREAS the agricultural industry in the United States can 31 greatly benefit from this trade agreement through increased 32 government subsidies to farmers, growers, retailers, and other 33





business sectors that were affected by the recent decrease in 1 2 exports to China; and 3 WHEREAS, China is one of the top markets to which the State 4 5 exports goods and services; and 6 7 WHEREAS, in 2017, Hawaii exported roughly \$121,000,000 worth of goods and services to China, with the top goods being 8 9 petroleum and coal products, aerospace products and parts, basic chemicals, scrap products, and fruits and tree nuts; and 10 11 WHEREAS, increased trade with the second largest economy in 12 the world will allow the State to provide a better quality of 13 life for residents and visitors of the State by improving the 14 State's economy; now, therefore, 15 16 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirtieth Legislature 17 of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2020, the House of 18 Representatives concurring, that the Legislature expresses its 19 support of phase one of the United States - China trade 20 21 agreement; and 22 23 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the President of the 24 United States, United States Trade Representative, Governor, 25 Mayor of each county, President of the Chamber of Commerce 26 Hawaii, and President of the Chinese Chamber of Commerce Hawaii. 27 28 29 30 OFFERED BY:
