## SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF ACCOUNTING AND GENERAL SERVICES TO CONDUCT A STUDY TO DETERMINE VARIOUS ALTERNATIVES FOR THE REHABILITATION AND RENOVATION OF THE STATE CAPITOL REFLECTING POOL.

WHEREAS, the State Capitol is listed on the Hawaii Register 1 2 of Historic Places and on the National Register of Historic 3 Places: and 4 WHEREAS, the State Capitol building with its volcano 5 symbolic motif is architecturally significant among all of the 6 nation's state capitol buildings; and 7 8 WHEREAS, the reflecting pool surrounding the State Capitol 9 building continues to be a maintenance challenge attributable to 10 inadequate water circulation, high saline content, inadequacy of 11 the water proofing membrane, and the sheer surface area and 12 13 volume of water; and 14 WHEREAS, the Department of Accounting and General Services 15 is charged under section 26-6(b)(6), Hawaii Revised Statutes, 16 for the maintenance of all public buildings; and 17 18 19 WHEREAS, the State Capitol Management Committee, established under section 6E-34.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, has 20 21 oversight and management responsibility for the State Capitol reflecting pool; and 22 23 WHEREAS, since 2003, the Department of Accounting and 24 General Services has annually requested, but has not yet 25 received, adequate funding for construction relating to a 26 redesign of the State Capitol reflecting pool; and 27 28 WHEREAS, the Department of Accounting and General Services 29 has completed two condition assessments and issued two requests 30 for information to identify current methodologies for interim 31



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water treatment to continue to maintain the State Capitol 1 2 reflecting pool without major renovation; and 3 4 WHEREAS, water treatment methods identified as viable have not been successful at providing a visually acceptable solution; 5 6 and 7 8 WHEREAS, the Department of Accounting and General Services currently expends approximately \$100,000 annually for the 9 physical maintenance of the State Capitol reflecting pool; and 10 11 WHEREAS, the State Capitol reflecting pool continues to 12 leak into the occupied spaces beneath, causing water 13 infiltration and structural damage; and 14 15 WHEREAS, the current budget estimate for full design and 16 construction of the State Capitol reflecting pool is \$1,200,000 17 18 for design and \$14,000,000 for construction; and 19 WHEREAS, innovative and alternative solutions may identify 20 21 more feasible, sustainable renovation methods than previously considered; and 22 23 WHEREAS, the University of Hawaii School of Architecture 24 and the Hawaii State Council of the American Institute of 25 26 Architects may be able to assist in formulating plans for innovative and alternative solutions; now, therefore, 27 28 29 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirtieth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2020, the House of 30 Representatives concurring, that the Department of Accounting 31 and General Services is requested to conduct a study to 32 determine various alternatives for the rehabilitation and 33 renovation of the State Capitol reflecting pool; and 34 35 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the study: 36 37 38 (1) Include alternative solutions to address repair of 39 existing damage to the State Capitol reflecting pool, restoration of the pool and related damaged or non-40 functional building elements, waterproofing to prevent 41 water infiltration into the occupied spaces and 42
