SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DISABILITY AND COMMUNICATION ACCESS BOARD, IN COLLABORATION WITH THE OFFICE OF ENTERPRISE TECHNOLOGY SERVICES, TO CONVENE A WORKING GROUP ON ACCESSIBLE GOVERNMENT DOCUMENTS.

WHEREAS, an accessible document is a document created to be 1 2 as easily readable by a sighted reader as a low-vision or non-sighted reader; and 3 4 5 WHEREAS, accessible documents allow individuals who use screen readers to navigate through the document, utilize the 6 properties to move from one part of a document to another, hear 7 descriptions of photographs and images from image tags, and have 8 equal access to the information; and 9 10 WHEREAS, public agencies that are required to provide 11 accessible documents do not always have staff that understand 12 13 how to make the information accessible; and 14 WHEREAS, the increasing use of technology to communicate 15 can also present complications and challenges, such as the 16 various state agency websites that post public meeting notices, 17 agendas, and attached resource documents that may not 18 necessarily all be in accessible formats, especially when 19 attachments are scanned copies; and 20 21 WHEREAS, the State's Disability and Communication Access 22 Board serves as the public advocate of persons with disabilities 23 by providing advice and recommendations on matters relating to 24 access, with an emphasis on state and county legislative matters 25 and administrative rules, policies, and procedures, and also 26 provides technical assistance and guidance to state and county 27 entities to meet state, federal, and county requirements for 28 29 access for persons with disabilities; and



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WHEREAS, the State's Office of Enterprise Technology 1 Services, headed by the Chief Information Officer, is charged 2 3 with organizing, managing, and overseeing statewide information 4 technology governance, including establishing, coordinating, and 5 managing a program to provide a means for public access to public information and developing and operating an information 6 7 network; now, therefore, 8 9 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirtieth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2020, the House of 10 Representatives concurring, that the Disability and 11 Communication Access Board, in collaboration with the Office on 12 Enterprise Technology Services, is requested to convene a 13 14 working group on accessible government documents; and 15 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the working group: 16 17 18 (1) Research other states' laws and use technologies to 19 provide government documents, including documents 20 provided by private entities under contract with the State, in accessible formats; 21 22 (2) Evaluate and recommend strategies to improve the 23 provision of government documents, including documents 24 provided by private entities under contract with the 25 State, in accessible formats, including identifying 26 27 means for effective and efficient oversight; and 28 29 (3) Make recommendations to the Legislature about how to further the policy of providing accessible government 30 31 documents; and 32 33 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a representative of the Disability and Communication Access Board and representative of 34 the Office of Enterprise Technology Services are requested to 35 serve as co-chairs of the working group and invite one 36 representative from each of the following entities to serve as 37 working group members: 38 39 40 (1)The Center on Disability Studies at the University of 41 Hawai'i at Mānoa; 42
