SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE COUNTIES AND DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH TO CONTINUE TO WORK ON SUSTAINABLE WATER MEASURES AND SUPPORT ONGOING WATER CONSERVATION EFFORTS.

1	WHEREAS, Hawaii receives consistent rainfall, has
2	advantageous geology for aquifers, and has high-quality drinking
3	water stores; and
4	
5	WHEREAS, recent findings raise concerns about the long-term
6	water security for the State as members of the scientific
7	community, including the University of Hawaii, have documented
8	troubling trends in recent decades, including reduced rainfall,
9	higher evaporation rates, and declining stream flows; and
10	higher evaporation faces, and decriming scream flows, and
11	WHEREAS, evidence suggests that rainfall has decreased by
12	twenty-two percent in Hawaii over the last thirty years; and
12	twenty-two percent in nawari over the rast thirty years, and
13 14	WHEREAS, while computer models differ markedly in their
15	predictions regarding precipitation patterns and water
16	availability in Hawaii over the coming decades, the unmistakable
17	observed trend is one of decreasing rainfall and increased
17	incidence of drought; and
10 19	incidence of diodync, and
20	WHEREAS, if the current trend holds, by 2030 Hawaii will
20 21	receive only three quarters of the rain that fell in 1985; and
21	receive only chice quarters of the fail that feff in 1905, and
23	WHEREAS, Hawaii has recently made progress on increasing
24	water reuse, conservation, and recharge through the statewide
25	Fresh Water Initiative, which aims to increase fresh water
26	supply by one hundred million gallons per day by 2030; and
20 27	Supply by one number willion gallons per day by 2050, and
28	WHEREAS, Act 42, Session Laws of Hawaii 2015, authorized
20 29	the counties to charge user fees to create and maintain any

1 stormwater management or infrastructure, which encourages water recharge and encourages the protection of water resources; and 2 3 4 WHEREAS, the City and County of Honolulu has been the leader in evaluating the merits of a stormwater utility for Oahu 5 as a way to better manage stormwater, increase green 6 infrastructure for improved water recharge, and demonstrate more 7 accountability for stormwater program operations; and 8 9 WHEREAS, Act 170, Session Laws of Hawaii 2016, requires all 10 state and county facilities to use reclaimed water for non-11 potable uses by December 31, 2045; and 12 13 WHEREAS, Act 141, Session Laws of Hawaii 2017, requires the 14 15 adoption of Universal Plumbing Code updates, among other building code and standard updates, within two years of official 16 publication; and 17 18 19 WHEREAS, because of Act 141, Session Laws of Hawaii 2017, plumbing code updates will take effect for all counties in 2020; 20 21 and 22 23 WHEREAS, Kauai County has been the leader on plumbing code updates that provide more stringent rules on water conservation 24 and further details on water reuse design standards; and 25 26 WHEREAS, in 2018, S.R. No. 74, S.D. 2, required a water 27 reuse task force to be organized to discuss how to scale water 28 29 reuse in Hawaii and overcome barriers; and 30 WHEREAS, in 2019, the Legislature provided for two water 31 reuse demonstration projects; and 32 33 WHEREAS, Act 202, Session Laws of Hawaii 2019, requires the 34 Department of Health to adopt rules for on-site non-potable 35 water reuse systems, which will provide invaluable information 36 37 to developers and engineers; and 38 WHEREAS, multiple entities, including government, non-39 profit, business, and academics, are collaborating to enhance 40 water conservation reuse and recharge in the State to ensure 41

1 fresh water access for current and future generations; now, therefore, 2 3 4 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirtieth Legislature 5 of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2020, the House of Representatives concurring, that the counties and Department of 6 7 Health are requested to continue to work on sustainable water 8 measures and support ongoing water conservation efforts; and 9 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the counties are requested to 10 update plumbing codes to the most recent versions before 11 12 mandatory deadlines take effect; and 13 14 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the counties are requested to 15 contemplate developing stormwater utilities to encourage sustainable stormwater management practices; and 16 17 18 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Health is 19 requested to continue work on developing on-site non-potable 20 water reuse system rules to ensure the safe and efficient use of recycled water at the building level; and 21 22 23 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the counties and Department of Health are requested to continue to support ongoing efforts to 24 enhance fresh water supplies in Hawaii and increase water 25 conservation, reuse, and recharge; and 26 27 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 28 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Governor, Director 29 of Health, Mayor of the City and County of Honolulu, Mayor of 30 the County of Hawaii, Mayor of the County of Maui, and Mayor of 31 the County of Kauai. 32 33 34 35 OFFERED BY: 6.4 SCR HMS 3
