SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

URGING THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION TO INCREASE ACCESS TO TRAUMA-INFORMED CARE FOR PUBLIC SCHOOL STUDENTS WHO EXPERIENCE SEXUAL VIOLENCE.

1 WHEREAS, sexual violence and sexual harassment are growing concerns on public school campuses; and 2 3 WHEREAS, sexual violence and sexual harassment impair 4 5 students' ability to concentrate on educational objectives and compromise students' sense of safety and overall well-being; and 6 7 WHEREAS, under Title IX of the Education Amendments of 8 9 1972, all forms of sexual harassment and sexual violence are prohibited in any education program or activity that receives 10 federal funding; and 11 12 WHEREAS, according to a survey conducted by the American 13 14 Association of University Women, fifty-eight percent of students in grades seven to twelve report experiencing sexual harassment; 15 and 16 17 WHEREAS, according to the nonprofit organization Stop 18 Sexual Assault in Schools, thirty-two percent of students who 19 experienced sexual assault or sexual harassment reported not 20 wanting to go back to school after being assaulted or harassed; 21 22 and 23 24 WHEREAS, according to the United States Department of 25 Education, nearly half of teens who experience teen dating violence, including sexual violence, experience abuse on campus; 26 27 and 28 WHEREAS, according to the anti-abuse organization Break the 29 Cycle, eighty percent of high school counselors feel unprepared 30



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1 to provide trauma-informed care to students who report being abused; and 2 3 4 WHEREAS, trauma-informed care involves providing school 5 staff and students with the skills and support necessary to manage reactions to traumatic stress and build a positive school 6 7 climate; now, therefore, 8 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirtieth Legislature 9 of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2020, the House of 10 Representatives concurring, that the Department of Education is 11 urged to increase access to trauma-informed care for public 12 school students who experience sexual violence; and 13 14 15 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Education is requested to offer training in trauma-informed care to teachers, 16 administrators, and school staff to improve reporting, 17 18 preventing, and intervening in cases of sexual violence 19 throughout the Department; and 20 21 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Education is urged to collaborate with victim service providers that assist 22 23 survivors of sexual violence in the development of school-based programs and protocols to help identify and support students who 24 are victims of sexual violence; and 25 26 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that at least twenty days prior to 27 the convening of the Regular Session of 2021, the Department of 28 29 Education is requested to submit to the Legislature a report of its progress in implementing trauma-informed care practices 30 throughout the Department, including any proposed legislation; 31 32 and 33 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 34 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Governor, Lieutenant 35 Governor, members of the Board of Education, and the 36 Superintendent of Education. 37 38 39 **40** OFFERED BY: Clarence K Drich 2 SCR HMS 2020-108 olo hedor
