SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE STATE OF HAWAII TO CREATE A FRAMEWORK OF POLICIES AND METRICS FOR BUILDING A SUSTAINABLE ECONOMIC FUTURE.

WHEREAS, the State of Hawaii, through the Department of 1 Business, Economic Development, and Tourism, should implement 2 statewide initiatives and conduct activities to stimulate 3 business, economic diversity, and economic growth; and 4 5 6 WHEREAS, the State of Hawaii has limited resources and 7 efficient use of those resources requires addressing 8 fundamental elements, including people, education, and policies; 9 and 10 WHEREAS, the State of Hawaii should develop its own path to 11 12 economic growth rather than attempt to imitate the path of 13 Silicon Valley and other technology hubs; and 14 15 WHEREAS, the State of Hawaii should focus its efforts on economic development by utilizing concepts set forth by Dr. Paul 16 17 Romer, an American economist, recipient of the 2018 Nobel 18 Memorial Prize in Economic Studies, and pioneer of the 19 Endogenous Growth Theory; 20 21 WHEREAS, the Endogenous Growth Theory holds that investment in human capital, innovation, and knowledge are significant 22 23 contributors to economic growth and that the long-run growth 24 rate of an economy depends on policy measures such as subsidies 25 for research and development or education; now, therefore, 26 27 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirtieth Legislature 28 of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2020, the House of 29 Representatives concurring, that the State of Hawaii, through 30 the Department of Business, Economic Development, and Tourism, 31 is strongly urged to set policies utilizing the Endogenous 32 Growth Theory to foster investment in human capital, innovation, and the building of knowledge; and 33
