## SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

URGING STATE DEPARTMENTS TO PROCURE LOCALLY-GROWN PRODUCE.

1 WHEREAS, Hawaii's mild climate supports a wide variety of agriculture, including avocados, bananas, guava, papayas, 2 tomatoes, corn, lettuce, potatoes, taro, and other produce; and 3 4 WHEREAS, the State hosts approximately three thousand six 5 hundred crop farms; and 6 7 8 WHEREAS, reliance on imported food leaves the State 9 vulnerable to natural disasters and other catastrophic events; and 10 11 12 WHEREAS, buying local produce lessens the State's carbon footprint by reducing the need to transport food long distances; 13 14 and 15 WHEREAS, buying local produce benefits the State's economy 16 17 and supports small businesses, including family- and veteranowned farms; and 18 19 20 WHEREAS, doing business with local farmers creates more transparency and accountability in the State's food system; now 21 therefore, 22 23 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirtieth Legislature 24 of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2020, the House of 25 Representatives concurring, that all state departments, when 26 procuring produce, are urged to buy Hawaii products when 27 available; and 28 29 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 30 31 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Governor; Comptroller; Chair of the Board of Agriculture; Attorney 32 General; Director of Finance; Director of Business, Economic 33 Development, and Tourism; Director of Commerce and Consumer 34
