SENATE RESOLUTION

URGING THE GOVERNOR TO CREATE A COLOR-CODED ADVISORY SYSTEM TO ADDRESS THE RAPIDLY CHANGING THREAT OF COVID-19.

WHEREAS, considering the recent developments regarding 1 COVID-19, or novel coronavirus, which causes a mild to severe 2 respiratory illness, and the increasing danger it poses to our 3 public; and 4 5 WHEREAS, the government of the State of Hawaii has a duty 6 to inform and protect its citizens; and 7 8 WHEREAS, constituents have many questions based on a lack 9 of information, and it is imperative to not only promote healthy 10 hygiene and social distancing, but to also take steps to assure 11 the public clearly understands the level of threat our 12 communities face; and 13 14 WHEREAS, the President of the United States has announced a 15 travel ban on persons arriving from Europe; and 16 17 WHEREAS, countries around the world are implementing 18 procedures to combat and attempt to control the threat and 19 spread of COVID-19. For example, Saudi Arabia is restricting 20 travel to holy sites; South Korea is implementing quarantines 21 enforced by criminal charge; Northern Italy is imposing army-22 quarded lockdowns of its towns, schools, and universities; China 23 has implemented lockdowns of its cities, travel, and other 24 public venues; Japan has closed its schools; France has 25 requested its citizens to abandon the traditional "bise" 26 greeting and banned public gatherings of five thousand people or 27 more; Iran has suspended its parliament; and Switzerland has 28 banned gatherings of more than one thousand people; and 29 30 WHEREAS, counties and states across our nation are calling 31 for, or have already declared states of emergency, with the 32 states of California, Florida, and Washington having already 33 declared a state of emergency; and



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1 WHEREAS, Mayors of Kauai, Maui, and Honolulu have already 2 issued separate proclamations of emergency to combat the threat 3 of COVID-19; and 4 5 WHEREAS, government agencies, such as the Department of 6 7 Defense and other states, such as Washington, have already implemented tiered response protocols; and 8 9 WHEREAS, Hawaii state government needs to present a 10 unified, cohesive response in the form of a singular, 11 universally applicable tiered response protocol that informs the 12 public and state agencies alike of both the current threat level 13 posed by COVID-19 and the government's according response; and 14 15 WHEREAS, the Department of Homeland Security has previously 16 implemented a color-coded advisory system used to communicate 17 risk levels for previous threats to the public's health and 18 welfare that is easily understood by and familiar to the public; 19 and 20 21 WHEREAS, this previously used advisory system requires 22 clear details in the context of the current situation to be 23 effective; and 24 25 WHEREAS, the risk posed by COVID-19 can rapidly change, 26 necessitating a system that can be quickly adjusted to reflect 27 the level of risk posed by COVID-19 as well as the appropriate 28 responses to the various risk levels; and 29 30 WHEREAS, this previously used system provides a means for 31 the government to quickly and easily inform the public of 32 updates to the situation and to plan appropriately in the event 33 of changing risk levels; now, therefore, 34 35 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirtieth Legislature 36 of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2020, that the 37 Governor is urged to create a color-coded advisory system 38 consistent with the system previously developed and used by the 39 Department of Homeland Security to address the rapidly changing 40 threat of COVID-19; and 41 42
