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BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that all state departments and 1 attached agencies are requested to inform the President of the 2 Senate and members of the Senate and Speaker of the House of 3 Representatives and members of the House of Representatives when 4 adjusting or deviating from normal operating procedures, such as 5 reduced hours, telecommuting, or cancellation of public 6 meetings; and 7 8 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that all state departments and 9 attached agencies are requested to communicate all new 10 procedures being implemented and include the start and end dates 11 of the new procedures; and 12 13 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 14 Resolution be transmitted to the Governor and all executive 15

branch departments and attached agencies.

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
